



EMRS State Voting Intentions Poll – August 2023 REPORT VERSION: FINAL

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The survey was conducted from the 15th to the 21st of August 2023.

1,000 adult Tasmanian residents were interviewed and responses weighted to reflect the Tasmanian adult voting population.

A sample of this size provides a maximum margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points at the 95% confidence level.

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
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TASMANIAN STATE VOTING INTENTIONS







The most recent EMRS poll was conducted from the 15th to the 21st of August 2023, calling landline and mobile phone numbers throughout Tasmania.

Summary:


- After a significant drop in May, support for the Liberal State Government has increased +2pts to 38%.
- Support for the Labor Party has increased 1pt to 32% since May.
- Support for The Greens is down by 1pt to 14%.
- 16% of respondents say they will vote for someone other than a Liberal. Labor or Tasmanian Greens candidate, with 14% supporting an independent candidate.

Q. If the Tasmanian State Election for the House of Assembly was held today, who would you vote for? If unsure, respondents were then asked: Q2. Even if it's a slight leaning, would it be the Liberal Party, the Labor Party, the Greens, an Independent, or some other minor party? Respondents that declined to answer were removed from analysis - Aug-2023: n=939

Liberal's Jeremy Rockliff has regained a 3pt lead over Labor's Rebbeca White as preferred premier, where 42% of respondents say they prefer Rockcliff compared to 39% who prefer White.

Rockcliff has improved his positioning since May, gaining 4pts in this August track. White has dropped 1pt.
