intentional, sustainable investments in their health and wellbeing; and

WHEREAS: We are committed to advancing equitable, responsive, and effective prevention initiatives

that address barriers and build on the resilience of Oregon's communities to ensure all

children and families are healthy and thriving; and

WHEREAS: We recognize the need to prioritize children and invest in robust prevention strategies like

home visiting, childcare and early education, family-strengthening policies, economic supports, social justice initiatives, access to housing, health, and mental health care, and community-based child abuse prevention programs at all levels of government; and

WHEREAS: We acknowledge that in order to solve the public health issue of abuse and neglect we must

work together to change hearts and mindsets through storytelling and sharing, elevating lived experience, centering the needs of families, breaking down bias and barriers, and inspiring

action from expected and unexpected partners in prevention; and

WHEREAS: Prevention is possible when we are working in partnership across disciplines, generations,

and geography to address the root causes of violence and abuse and collectively build a

sustainable system to advance child and family wellbeing.

THEREFORE: I, Tina Kotek, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim April 2024 to be

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
