Christ is risen! Our Easter joy continues for a total of seven weeks. (Really, we celebrate Easter every Sunday – that's actually why we worship on Sunday!) During this season, we hear how Jesus appeared to His followers, teaching them and showing them that He was alive and what it means for us still today. #### TODAY'S THEME: THE HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the only festival in the Christian Church dedicated to a teaching rather than a historical event. On Trinity Sunday we think about God's essence. God clearly says that He is "one"there are no other gods beside Him. At the same time, He reveals that He is "three" – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit-and yet He is not three gods but only one God. The term coined by Christians long ago to describe this beautiful mystery is "Trinity," coming from the Latin words for "three" and "one." God

is "triune": He is three divine Persons, yet one God. The true God reveals His essence to us not so that we can understand Him, but so that we can know Him and worship Him as He is. Today we receive the gifts of the Holy Trinity and worship Him!



#### **PARTICIPATION & CHILDREN**

Even from their earliest years, children are models of faith for all of us. Our worship format not only encourages families to be together, but is designed for active engagement and participation by all, including children. The sights and sounds of active children are a great joy to us and evidence that God is

## **CONFESSION OF SINS**

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

1 John 1:8,9

Let us confess our sins to the Lord.

Holy God, gracious Father,

I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved you with my whole heart;

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sin

with His innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in Him, I pray: God have mercy on me, a sinner.

Reginald Heber (1783-1826) wrote this hymn for Holy Trinity Sunday. He uses reverent and apocalyptic language from Revelation 4-5 and Isaiah 6 to sing the great majesty of our triune God.

The Invocation recalls our baptism where the Triune God put His name on us as His very own. It is the historic Christian practice to make the sign of the cross upon hearing these words throughout the service whenever the sign of the cross is made.

There is a wide gulf between God in His holiness and us in our sinfulness. We put on clean clothes in the morning to come to church, but more importantly we need a clean heart in the presence of the Lord. So at the very beginning of the Divine Service, we lay our sins on Jesus through confession and are assured that God does not condemn us for our sins, but forgives us for the sake and on account of Jesus.

## **OUR LORD'S ABSOLUTION**

John 20:23

Our gracious Father in heaven has been merciful to us. He sent His only Son, Jesus Christ, who gave His life as the atoning sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.

Because Jesus took away the sins of the world, He authorized His followers to announce His forgiveness to all who repent of their sins. Jesus' forgiveness, proclaimed by His servants, "absolves" us, that is, it sets us free from the guilt of our sins.

Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of the Word and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son # and of the Holy Spirit.



This ancient song comes from the Orthodox church and sings praise to our triune God. Christians have been singing this song on Trinity Sunday for at least 1600 years. The title "Trisagion" is Greek for "three times holy."

## The Prayer of the Day

helps us focus on a central theme taken from the Scripture readings of the day. There is a specific Prayer for each Sunday and festival of the church year, many of which are centuries old.

Today's prayer echoes thoughts from Isaiah 6, where God cleansed Isaiah's lips and forgave his sin so that he could go and share the LORD's mercy. We pray for the same cleansing and confidence.

## **SCRIPTURE READING**

Genesis 1:1-2, 26-31; 2:1-3



n the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. <sup>2</sup> Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over

the waters. ...

<sup>26</sup> Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air, over the livestock, over all the earth, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

<sup>28</sup> God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

We see all three persons of the Godhead at work here in the creation account. The Trinity speaks to itself and of itself in the amazing words that displayed God's intent for the crown of His creation: "Let us make man in our image."



- <sup>29</sup> Then God said, "I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the whole earth and every tree that has fruit with seed in it. They will be yours for food.
- <sup>30</sup> And to all the beasts of the earth and all the birds of the air and all the creatures that move on the ground–everything that has the breath of life in it–I give every green plant for food." And it was so.
- <sup>31</sup> God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning—the sixth day.
- 2:1 Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array.
- <sup>2</sup> By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. <sup>3</sup> And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.

## THE ATHANASIAN CREED

Part I

Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith. Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.

For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit. The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;

yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

This Christian statement of faith is named after **Athanasius**, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the Fourth Century. It was prepared to help Christians combat a grave error that attacked the Bible's teaching of the Holy Trinity. Martin Luther once said of this creed: "I do not know of any more important document of the New Testament church since the days of the apostles."

<sup>14</sup> May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Paul the apostle concludes his final letter to the believers in Corinth. He had much to address and correct in this congregation and now prays the triune God blesses their unity in faith.

## THE ATHANASIAN CREED

Part II

In the same way

the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, and the Holy Spirit is almighty;

yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; yet they are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.

For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord,

so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.

The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son.

And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior, but all three persons are coequal and coeternal,

so that in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshiped as one God and one God worshiped as three persons.

Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

This portion of the creed is written against the heresy known as "tritheism," which teaches that God is one but is divided into three different parts thus denying that Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is each true God on His own.



## THE HOLY GOSPEL

Matthew 28:16-20

The disciples meet Jesus on a mountain in Galilee
—a man who had died, but now lives again. And if what Jesus said about Himself was true, then God had died and risen for them too; and now, God Himself was calling them to a ministry of all nations.

The disciples show their faith in Jesus by worshiping Him and listening to what He said.



hen the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where

Jesus had told them to go. <sup>17</sup> When they saw him, they
worshiped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> Then Jesus came to them

and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

The Gospel of our Lord.

## THE ATHANASIAN CREED

Part III

The final part of the Athanasian Creed addresses another heresy that came up at the time which denied that Jesus was both true man and true God in one person. Our confession here is clear: to believe in the true God of the Bible is to believe in Jesus who is truly both God and man.

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and He is man, born in time from the nature of His mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh,

Equal to the Father as to His deity, less than the Father as to His humanity;

And though He is both God and man, Christ is not two persons but one,

One, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God;

One, indeed not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person;

For just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being,

So God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there will come to judge the living and the dead. At His coming all people will rise with their own bodies to answer for their personal deeds.

Those who have done good will enter eternal life, But those who have done evil will go into eternal fire.

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

This modern hymn puts the words we just heard in 2 Corinthians 13 to a powerful tune: "May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

2 Timothy 4:22).



It is truly good and right that we should at all times and in all places give you thanks, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, and now we confess that you, with your Son and the Holy Spirit, are one God and one Lord, and we acknowledge you as our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

## **S**ANCTUS

## "Holy, Holy, Holy" | Isaiah 6:1-3; Matthew 21:9



We praise our God using words from the angels around God's throne (Isaiah 6) because our Savior is here with us in a special way in Holy Communion. We also echo the words spoken of Jesus as He entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. As Jesus entered on a lowly donkey that day, so He comes to us today in simple bread and wine.

This song is called the **Sanctus**, which is Latin for 'holy.' It is also one of the oldest song of the liturgy already present as early as the turn of the first century.

## THE WORDS OF INSTITUTION

"Verba" | Matthew 26:26-28

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying: "Take and eat. This is my # body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, "Drink from it all of you; this is my blood & of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

Amen.

The Words (Latin: 'verba') of Institution both proclaim the words of Jesus and declare the Sacrament to be what it is: His true body and blood, under the bread and wine, given for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins.

The sign of the cross reminds us of Christ's death.

John the Baptizer once called Jesus the "Lamb of God." The innocent death of Christ in our place frees us from sin's guilt and condemnation.

Through His atoning work, we have peace with God. This song is known as the Angus Dei, Latin for 'Lamb of God' and dates back to the 7th century.

In the land of a 'thousand oaks,' oak trees are kind of important. So important, in fact, they're even protected by city ordinance which forbids them from being cut down! But did you know oak trees are also important to God? Not only because they are part of His creation but also because God once used oak trees to describe His people. Now, being compared to a tree might not sound like much of a compliment, but think about what God is saying! Oak trees are powerful and majestic; they have deep and strong roots; they are beautifully adorned with leaves to provide shade and comfort for those nearby; they can withstand harsh drought conditions; and all of this happens because they thrive and grow in the presence of the sun.

This is why Prince of Peace exists: to plant and strengthen "oak tree" Christians. We believe this happens when people come into the presence of the Son, Jesus Christ, who draws near to us through His Word (the Bible) and Sacraments (Baptism & Communion).
