


SAMUEL P. TAYLOR STATE PARK

- No wood fires, charcoal only in grills.





Heart's Desire Beach

Our farm is surrounded by coastline. Across the bay, Heart's Desire State Beach is a wonderful spot to swim, grill, and picnic. Stinson Beach (forty minutes down scenic

Highway 1) is a spectacular ocean beach with grills, tables, and plenty of room to throw a frisbee with friends.

Doran Regional Park (in Bodega Bay) allows dogs, has a picnic area with grills, campsites, and a boardwalk. Bodega Dunes, about forty minutes North on Highway One,

has a picnic area, campground, and showers. Just south

fantastic, grassy picnic area bordered by oak trees and giant bay laurels, hiking trails, and a recreated Miwok Village (complete with a sweat lodge!). Millerton Point

gorgeous place to picnic on the beach and watch the sunset. When you visit any of these neighboring parks or beaches, please do not leave any shells or trash behind.

Respect the space as you would our picnic area. Your business will keep us alive during this transition, so please come visit us at the farm!

Additionally, these beaches have limited facilities, but are stunning places to visit. Bring a picnic basket, blanket, and cooler of oysters. Here are just a few of the family friendly places to visit:

SHELL BEACH: (30 minutes) Located in Tomales Bay State Park—be prepared for a ¼ mile hike to the beach.

LIMANTOUR BEACH: (45 minutes) Take a right onto Sir Francis Drake Road just south of Point Reyes Station. Take a left onto Bear Valley Road. Then right onto Limantour Road.

SOUTH BEACH: (One hour) Take a right onto Sir Francis Drake Road just south of Point Reyes Station. Take South Beach Road .7 miles to the beach)

NORTH BEACH: (45 minutes) Take a right onto Sir Francis Drake Road just south of Point Reyes Station. Take North Beach Road .6 miles to the beach)

DRAKE'S BEACH: (One hour) Take a right onto Sir Francis Drake Road just south of Point Reyes Station. Take a left on to Drake's Beach Road—there are grills here, and a visitor center.

ABBOT'S LAGOON: (One hour) off of Pierce Point Road—there's a 1.5 mile walk to the beach.

\$7 dollar entrance fee for day use, or \$1 per person for vehicles with more than ten people. Dogs allowed on leash (no more than six feet in length) Ranger phone number: (707) 875-3540. Picnic area, campsites, boat launch (can accommodate boats up to 20 feet), boardwalk, and beach wheelchairs available on request.

DRAKE'S BEACH

1 Drake's Beach Road, Inverness, CA 94937 45 minutes away (West) Hours: 6 AM to 10 PM

About five picnic tables with grills (back right corner of the parking lot). Dogs are allowed in the parking lot and picnic area on leash, but not on the beach. Beer, wine, and hard alcohol are

allowed, but no kegs. Wood fires are permitted on the beach with a permit (these can be obtained for free at Bear Valley Visitor Center or Drake's Beach Visitor Center).

FIVE BROOKS TRAIL HEAD

Highway One, Olema, CA 94950 10 miles away (South) Hours: 6 AM to 10 PM

About five picnic tables with grills. Dogs are allowed on leash. Beer, wine, and hard alcohol are allowed, but no kegs.

HEART'S DESIRE BEACH

1208 Pierce Point Road, Inverness, CA 94937 35 minutes away (across the bay) Hours: 8 AM to sunset

\$8 dollar entrance fee (\$7 for anyone 62 or over). About six picnic tables; Vista Point Group Picnic Area may be reserved in advance by large groups by contacting events coordinator David Kopler (415) 898-4362. The park fills up early and they will not let people in once all the parking is full. Dogs are not allowed on the beach; they are allowed on leash at the Vista Point Group Picnic. Open fires are permitted.
