ESTABLISHING CHARACTERS

Eric Edson's The Story Solution: How We Feel A Story

Key traits in an opening:

- Courage (not optional)
- Unfair Injury
- Skill

- Funny
- Just Plain Nice
- In Danger

- Loved by Friends & Family
- Hard Working
- Obsess

INTERIORITY

Rebecca Makkai levels of interiority: Go Deep! - by Rebecca Makkai - SubMakk

- Reportage
- Sensory input, without commentary
- Internal physical reaction, without commentary
- Reportage or sensory input with commentary and/or interpretation

- Internal monologue in reaction to events in scene
- Memory / projection into the future / association / tangent
- Self-reflection, or narrative reflection, on psychology or emotion
- Subconscious

And pitfalls - Interior(ity) Design Fails - by Rebecca Makkai - SubMakk

- Empty head characters
- Not enough interiority during crucial scenes
- Too much interiority during moments when nothing much is happening
- Relying on heart and breathing instead of proper interiority
