


Our Values

- Our logo visualizes growth coming from knowing the Word of God.





The Hybrid School Model

A Growing Movement

- We are not the only school using this model
- These schools are all trying to leverage the school and home relationship in a stronger way
- Most of these schools are Christian and value the role of parents
- In this model, parents are teachers who are being supported and strengthened by the school
- Most people here tonight have not been a part of a school like this, so I need to describe how it will work





The Hybrid School


Definitions

What It Is

- A blend of classroom instruction and home education for five days each week
- On campus 2 1/2 days a week and at home the remainder
- An academic institution that will seek accreditation as soon as possible

What It Is NOT

- A homeschool group
- A co-op
- A charter school
- A parent-directed program





The Hybrid School Model

An Overview of the School/Home Partnership

The School

- Maintains student records and transcripts
- Arranges standardized testing
- Provides curriculum and planning
- Supplies educational facilities

Master Teacher (MT)

- Provides scope/sequence, lesson plans
- Bridges classwork to homework
- Supports and encourages
- Teaches students in the classroom

Parent Teacher (PT)

- Provides direction and support at home
- Teaches MT generated lesson plans
- Provides learning environment/supplies
- Plans daily activities on home days





The Hybrid School

How does it work?

Master Teacher (MT) Role

- FCA provides the Master Teacher (MT)
- The MT plans 5 days, both the class and the lessons
- The MT teaches the core subjects: Bible, math, language arts, history, and science
- The MT posts the plans where the parent accesses them

Parent Teacher (PT) Role

- The Parent Teacher (PT) follows up with the lessons at home; downloads the lesson plans
- The PT plans home learning for their children
- Teaches handwriting and spelling
- Follows up on material covered in class, monitors student to ensure work is finished in timely manner and submitted to MT



How Do Combination Classes Work?

- Math instruction will be kept separate according to grade unless there is objective data to show otherwise
- Reading will be according to reading level
- History and science will be taught collectively with grade differentiation (when possible)






The School Day

- Noon Dismissal








Weekly Schedule

FCA School Community

Building Lives

- Planned field trips
- Parent Bootcamp for training using the hybrid model (required)
- Volunteer opportunities for parents. We will post needs for people to sign up.
- Arts classes and other enrichment classes will be added over the next few years
- Student leadership opportunities
- Weekly chapel service





Miscellaneous

- Students will be expected to be in class at minimum 80% of class time
- There will be an initial summative assessment at the beginning of the year and then at least one each year.
- Homework on Tuesday and Wednesday will be none, or light (math)
- While there will be reading assigned, parents are free to supplement with their own literature. Reading aloud is encouraged!
- Students will wear uniforms (see information sheets)
- There will be a Parent/Student Handbook with policies clarified, including behavior





Benefits of FCA

- Bible-based instruction ensuring a biblical worldview in all subjects
- Tightly integrated with the church community
- Week is planned by the MT providing a road map for the parent
- Takes the guesswork out of homeschooling
- Provides a rigorous academic education
- The PT is free to extend learning beyond what is taught in curriculum
- Small classes with time to focus on individual needs
