

MESSAGE FROM MARTIN SHEPHERD, RFCA REPRESENTATIVE TO THE FAIRFAX COUNTY LAKE ACCOTINK TASK FORCE

June 26th was the first meeting of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors #LakeAccotinkTaskForce!

More than 30 representatives from community and government organizations took part in the initial discussion and information session while over 25 additional concerned citizens observed the dialogue. Channel 16 aired the meeting live.

This initial meeting involved introductions and a historical brief of the lake as well discussions on the use of sub-committees and outside experts to help conduct the analysis on how to save the lake.

Meetings are scheduled every 2 weeks on Monday in the Government Center with the goal of completing the task force's analysis by the end of 2023.

TASK FORCE ANNOUNCED TO HELP SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK

Media Release - For Immediate Release from Allan Robertson - President, Save Lake Accotink

Nonprofit <u>Save Lake Accotink Organization</u> to Join Task Force to Evaluate Options for the Lake, Springfield, VA—June 5, 2023

The not-for-profit Save Lake Accotink organization is joining forces with the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to evaluate all options for Lake Accotink's future.



The creation of a new task force was approved unanimously by the Board of Supervisors during a May 23 meeting.

"We are excited about the county's commitment to save this precious lake," said Allan Robertson, Save Lake Accotink President. "We are ready to get to work immediately with our neighbors and other stakeholders. We don't have any more time to waste. We need to act now to ensure Lake Accotink remains a viable

recreational, aesthetic, and environmental asset for generations yet to come."

The task force will be led by former Board of Supervisors Chair Sharon Bulova and will include former Braddock District Supervisor John Cook, as well as a Fairfax County Park Authority representative, and members of local community, environmental and nonprofit organizations. The Department of Public Works and Environmental Services will provide support to the task force.

"The goal is to find alternatives to the current dredge plan," Robertson said. "I know there is a solution that is cost-effective and less disruptive to the surrounding communities that will efficiently remove the sediment that is killing this Fairfax County treasure. Lake Accotink

is not only the most ADA-accessible lake in Fairfax County, its location near the Capital Beltway and the Mixing Bowl, makes it the most generally accessible lake in the county. We must act now to save this invaluable park asset from falling to neglect and indecision."

Save Lake Accotink is waiting to hear from former Board of Supervisors Chair Sharon Bulova on when the task force will begin meeting. In the meantime, the SLA team is building a list of options to explore and working with local communities to gain support.

###

The 55-acre Lake Accotink is a man-made reservoir located in the middle of a densely developed 30-square-mile watershed. It has required regular dredging to remove sediment and prevent it from filling in. The lake is loved for its beauty, recreation, and wildlife.

The lake also performs an important function, trapping sediment that would otherwise choke lower Accotink Creek, which is in the Chesapeake Bay watershed. The most recent dredge took place in 2008. Since 2016, Fairfax County has been exploring ways to address increased sedimentation and preserve Lake Accotink.

In early February 2023, the Fairfax County Park Authority and Department of Public Works and Environmental Services publicly announced their recommendation to the Board of Supervisors that Lake Accotink be allowed to fill in with silt from Accotink Creek. This is a sudden and unexpected reversal of the Board of Supervisors' 2019 unanimous endorsement in favor of financing the Lake Accotink Dredging Project, which would have saved the lake. Dredging was slated to begin in 2023.

We were pleased to see many gardeners using more native plants, which help sustain the pollinator insects, birds, and other wildlife. Native plants also require less pesticide use, watering, and weeding – so less work and expense for you!

If you want to support monarch butterflies, plant some milkweed (Asclepias). These are the host and food plants for Monarch caterpillars. Goldfinches love seeds from plants like asters and sunflowers. Oak trees are the caterpillar host for hundreds of butterfly and moth species, making it a keystone tree. For example, if you charge \$20 to your card, you will receive \$20 in SNAP tokens and \$20 in Match tokens to spend in the market. SNAP tokens can be spent on any SNAP-eligible item, while Match tokens can only be spent on fresh fruits and vegetables. 




