As Elks, the children in our communities are a major reason we exist and to that end January is the start of a lot of the Elks contests for the students in your area. These activities are a chance for kids to be recognized for their hard work.

While the Americanism Essay contest finished on December 15th, judging should be completed with lodge winners submitted to the district chair. Your lodge Hoop Shoot should already been held and your winners getting ready for the district shoot. Applications for the MVS scholarship closed in November, but the Legacy Scholarship is now open for children, stepchildren, and grandchildren of Elk members. This closes on February 3rd, so time is of the essence.

The Drug Awareness Program conducts several contests. These include an essay contest for 6th - 8th graders, a poster contest for 3rd - 5th graders, and for older students, a video contest. 

January is the beginning of the last quarter of the Lodge year. Be sure to have your membership retention and arrears program ready to work on having a +1 membership

gain for 2025! Have your committee reach out to delinquent Members. This personal contact could very well bring these Members back into our folds.

While we have so many Members who are active and going beyond the call of duty, we unfortunately have those who are delinquent in membership. We need to look over the lapsation list. Our delinquent Members had a reason for joining and they are worth keeping as active Members. Find out what you can do to improve this. Think of the missed opportunities that these delinquent Members could have had in making a legacy of service.

As we begin 2025, Lodges need to be focusing on several aspects: Our Members and membership, our Lodges and improvements, and our recognition to those who have given beyond the typical role of service.

There is no better way to recognize these people who have gone beyond the call of duty in their service to Elkdom than to award them with "Elk of the Year," "Officer of the Year," and "Citizen of the Year." The awards form can be accessed in CLMS2Web. They need to be submitted prior to March 31 so that the certificates can be printed and sent back to the Lodges for Officer installations. As an Exalted Ruler, you have an opportunity to recognize those Members who are doing everything without even being asked.

Speaking of legacy, the Legacy Award scholarship is available until February 3, 2025. It provides \$4,000 scholarships to the children and grandchildren of Elks Members. Use the membership of Elkdom to pay it forward to help your children and grandchildren.

The end of year will be here before you know it. With the FRS system, your Lodge just needs to ensure all entries are current. The nice thing about the FRS system is your Lodge no longer needs to have the annual audit completed. However, you still must submit your 990 and 990T for each corporation in your Lodge. Have them completed by a qualified individual (e.g., CPA) and filed with the IRS and uploaded on Elks.org.

Elkdom's Heart for America means looking for ways to recognize the value of our Members, membership, and the value of looking forward to the future. Keep up the good work you are doing in your Lodge and community. I want you to know how much I appreciate all that you are doing for Elkdom. God bless you and God bless America.

Lodge Improvement Fund Grants

Last year, the Oregon State Elks Association launched the Lodge Improvement Fund Grants to assist lodges with improvement or beautification projects to enhance to appearance and perception of their facilities. We currently award two \$1,000 grants each year to lodges who apply and complete their All-American Lodge contest form. This grant application is meant to be easy with a simple project description, project budget, and some before pictures of the proposed project. To simplify the submission even further, we have made the grant application an on-line process. Which can be submitted by going to: https://www.oregonelks.org/lodgeimprovement and completing the form on that page by February 15th.

Submissions will be reviewed by the LIF Committee and sent to the OSEA State Officers for final consideration at the March State Officers Meeting. Winners will be awarded a the 2025 OSEA Summer Convention in Seaside.

Keep in mind, the purpose of the grant is for lodge improvement and not lodge maintenance or repairs of lodge equipment. Some examples of lodge improvement projects include:

- Addition of an Elk statue
- Updated light fixtures
- Repainting or adding a mural
- · Replacing carpet or flooring
- Landscape or hard-scape.

Online membership inquiries

It used to be that people only joined the Elks because they were invited to do so by a friend, family member, coworker, etc. But today we receive an increasing number of on-line membership inquiries through elks.org. This year alone we have received 706 inquiries through elks.org. Of those only 83 have become members with an additional 16 currently in the membership process. This is a conversion rate of just over 14%. In the new year, let's focus on these on-line inquiries and do more than just send them an application and hope for the best. Send them an email or better yet give them a call and invite them to the lodge to come in, have dinner, and learn more about the Elks.

The Lodge Secretary receives the membership inquiry through CLMS but a committee can support the secretary and help reach out to these individuals who are expressing interest in joining our order. And keep in mind, first impressions matter and make all the difference in converting someone from just being interested to being a member. Taking the time to engage with prospective members beyond just sending out an application or form letter can make all the difference.

With effort we can easily increase our conversion rate and add to our continued membership gains.

Local and national organizations are available to help with cancer concerns. Services needed can often be found in your own neighborhood. Here are some ideas:

Your Health Care Team: Doctors, nurses and social workers can provide information about your cancer diagnosis and treatment. Cancer centers are excellent sources of information. Hospital social workers and discharge coordinators are also great resources.

Local and County Government: Local governments often offer low-cost transportation. Government agencies have information on Social Security, state disability, Medicaid, income maintenance and food stamps.

The Cancer Support Helpline at https://www.cancersupportcommunity.org is one of many online resources and is staffed by community navigators and resource specialists who have extensive experience in helping people affected by cancer so that no one faces cancer alone. They provide guidance, resources, and support to cancer patients and their loved ones with a variety of needs. Information about cancer, identifying a local support group, or just finding someone who is willing to listen.

Their services include:

- Connecting callers to local or national resources, counseling, support groups, treatment lodging & transportation services, and other programs.
- Live web chat option for those who prefer not to call. See Chat Now window on website.
- Specialized information and navigation in finances & treatment costs, clinical trials, pediatric oncology, and genetics/genomics.
- Treatment decision-making education.
- Access to an online distress screening program to understand the patient's perspective in relation to their physical, emotional, psychological, social, practical, and/ or spiritual needs.
- · Guidance on the full scope of resources.
- Live, bilingual support in over Spanish navigation services.
- Over-the-phone translation 200 languages
