Professor Emeritus of International Law at Princeton University. He served as United Nations Special Rapporteur on Human Rights in the Palestinian Territories (2008-2014). He is the author of over 50 books including This Endangered Planet (2021), Public Intellectual: The Life of a Citizen Pilgrim (2021), and co-author of Liberating the United Nations: Realism with Hope (2024).



Educated in Germany, the UK and the US; UN civil servant (1968-2000); head of UN missions in Botswana, Pakistan and India; Director, UNDP European Office in Geneva; UN Assistant Secretary-General for Iraq. Professional interests: political accountability, multilateral sanctions and the linkage between human rights and human responsibilities. and co-author of Liberating the United Nations: Realism with Hope (2024).

South Africa's Minister of International Relations and Cooperation 2019-2024 and led the country's historic genocide case of December 2023 brought against Israel in the International Court of Justice; an ANC MP since majority rule in 1994; she held several ministerial positions, including Minister of Higher Education and Training (2018-2019), Minister of Science and Technology, and Minister of Home Affairs. Executive Director of The Tricontinental: Institute for Social Research and Chief Correspondent for Globetrotter; an Indian historian and journalist, author of forty books, including Washington Bullets, The Darker Nations, A Possible History of the Global South, and recently The Withdrawal: Iraq, Libya, Afghanistan, and the Fragility of U.S. Power (2022) and co-authored with Noam Chomsky On Cuba (2024).
