Florida Survey
May 2023

Overview

This report contains the results of a Civiqs survey of 400 adults in Florida from May 18-22, 2023. The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Sampled individuals were emailed by Civiqs and responded using a personalized link to the survey at civiqs.com.

The survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, and party identification to be representative of the population of adults in Florida. The general design effect due to weighting is 1.38. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 5.8\%$ at the 95% confidence level, accounting for the design effect. All survey results in this report are reported as percentages.
