



Who We are at Sage Ridge School

At a Glance:

- Founded in 1998 and nestled on 44 acres in the Mount Rose foothills, it remains Northern Nevada's only independent, non-sectarian, co-educational college preparatory day school.
- 5 Value Pillars (Scholarship, Respect, Integrity, Courage, and Community) encapsulate the school's culture.
- Educates 227 students in grades 3 through 12 and has 35 faculty and 13 staff.
- A fully accredited member of the Northwest Association of Independent Schools.
- Active member of the National Association of Independent Schools, Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, Association for Advancement of International Education, National/ Western Associations for College Admission Counseling, College Board, National Business Officers Association, and Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association.

The Sage Ridge Difference

- The Sage Ridge Way is a culture deeply embedded in all aspects of the school. Faculty, staff, coaches, and a dedicated parent community go above and beyond to help students reach their highest potential and thrive as young adults. A level of trust and leadership is placed upon students to do the right things and ethically live according to the school's Value Pillars and Honor Code.
- Each fall students attend Outdoor Education Week at different regional locations by grade level, integrating survival skills and socio-emotional learning competencies.
- Each spring students pick two "Sage Session" classes to study over two weeks. Faculty build sessions around their own personal interests to allow students to explore subjects outside the classroom setting.
- Freshmen are required to take a seminar course that teaches them critical thinking, organization and study skills, identifying core values, how to correctly cite sources using MLA, stress management, growth mindset, research methods, and public speaking, and introduction to college counseling. They build upon core life competencies to gain greater confidence, awareness, and social-emotional maturity.
- To get a taste of college life, seniors take a college-level humanities seminar as a capstone history class, write a 15-20 page research essay, and juggle a four-week, 60-hour internship (min. 3 hours per day) in May to discover possible career interests.

Three Schools, One Campus

Lower School

Grades 3-5

Flexible, personalized engagement is the priority of our self-contained, lower school classrooms.

Our youngest scholars are always active.

They are hungry for knowledge and our teachers keep pace with their eagerness through a myriad of techniques that encourage hands-on engagement and critical thinking.

Our Lower School teachers meaningfully challenge students, while supporting the individual needs of each child and communicating directly with parents. Students start on the path toward independence in an environment emphasizing organization and self-reflection. Computer fluency, writing skills, and public speaking are seamlessly integrated across the curriculum. Engaging classroom activities makes learning both innovative and fun.

- Classrooms are equipped with computers for every student for Grades 3-5.
- Students take physical education and have a daily rotation of arts (music, theatre, or visual art) and coding classes.
- Laboratory science classes are part of our core curriculum.
- Spanish classes begin in grade 3 and receive instruction twice a week.
- Students acquire study and organizational skills and engage in collaborative learning.
- Advanced math is available for accelerated learners.

Middle School

Grades 6-8

While early adolescence is often considered a difficult time in a child's life, Sage Ridge teachers see it as a rich and rewarding time of growth.

Our teachers meet the challenges of these years because they possess content knowledge, teaching expertise, and a deep understanding of how to support social-emotional learning. Students enter grade 7 as concrete observers and leave grade 8 with the capacity to analyze and think abstractly about complex problems while developing a strong sense of self.

- Laptops are fully integrated into our grades 6-8 curriculum.
- Students take physical education and have a daily rotation of arts (music, theater, or visual art) and computer programming classes.
- Computer programming classes focus on Robotics and JavaScript.
- Laboratory science classes are part of our core curriculum.
- Advanced math is available for accelerated learners.
- Foreign language classes continue in grade 6, with students taking one semester each of Latin and Spanish. Starting in grade 7, students choose one language on which to focus.





Three Schools, One Campus

Upper School

Grades 9-12

At Sage Ridge we understand that our Upper School launches a student's future. High school is a time for students to discover their passions while engaging in rigorous critical thinking and gaining mastery of academic disciplines. Leadership skills are cultivated through vast opportunities to create a lasting impact. Captain a sport. Start a club. Become the Editor-in-Chief. Propose an Independent Study. 
Everything about the high school experience prepares students to excel in their college of choice.

- Freshman Seminar equips students with critical thinking tools and sharpens public speaking skills.
- Advanced science classes prepare students for pre-medical college tracks or research positions early on in their college careers.
- Computer science and engineering classes enable students to take full advantage of our Innovation Lab.
- International students add a global dimension.
- Full-time college counselor takes a four-year approach to college counseling and knows every student well.
- Senior Seminar exposes students to a college-level seminar in preparation for their next step.
- Senior Thesis challenges seniors to write and defend a 15-20 page research essay.
- Senior Internship allows students to gain real-world experience in the field of their choice.

Our average AP pass rate is 87%, but we don't run the same AP program as everyone else. You may hear other high school students say they are taking 5-7 AP classes a year. But are they really taking a college-level class? Our AP classes result in students who can pass their AP exams, thus validating our curriculum as equivalent to a real college course. In addition, all our students who receive AP credit on their transcripts are required to sit for the exam. This means that our pass rates are the highest in the region even with all our AP students taking the exams!

Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- 62% of our high school students take Honors courses
- 50% of our high school students take AP courses
- 100% of students enrolled in an AP course sit for the AP exam
- Students must earn a 90 percent or higher grade in all their classes before being allowed to enroll in these courses





I took a biology class at UNR over the summer, and the professor originally didn't want to let me join because I hadn't taken college chemistry yet. From her experience, high school chemistry classes usually didn't prep kids enough for her class. Once I was in the class, I didn't have any issues with the chemistry sections.
