This is to advise that on March 11, 2019, Maritime Launch Service Ltd. submitted the Focus Report for the Canso Spaceport Facility Project for environmental assessment, in accordance with Part IV of the *Environment Act*.

The purpose of the proposed project is to construct and operate a private commercial space launch site that provides rocket launch services to clients. The project is located approximately 2-3 kilometers south of Canso, Guysborough County, Nova Scotia. A medium class orbital launch vehicle designed by Yuzhnoye SDO in the Ukraine, will transport satellites into orbit. A maximum of 8 launches per year with associated pre-flight activities such as mission rehearsals, is planned. The main project components include a launch control center, as well as a horizontal integration facility and a vertical launch area which are connected by a transportation route. The transportation route is approximately 2.4 kilometers in length, including a road and a railway. The construction of the project is scheduled to commence in 2019, with the first launch planned for 2021.

This is to advise that on March 11, 2019, Maritime Launch Service Ltd. submitted the Focus Report for the Canso Spaceport Facility Project for environmental assessment, in accordance with Part IV of the *Environment Act*.

The purpose of the proposed project is to construct and operate a private commercial space launch site that provides rocket launch services to clients. The project is located approximately 2-3 kilometers south of Canso, Guysborough County, Nova Scotia. A medium class orbital launch vehicle designed by Yuzhnoye SDO in the Ukraine, will transport satellites into orbit. A maximum of 8 launches per year with associated pre-flight activities such as mission rehearsals, is planned. The main project components include a launch control center, as well as a horizontal integration facility and a vertical launch area which are connected by a transportation route. The transportation route is approximately 2.4 kilometers in length, including a road and a railway. The construction of the project is scheduled to commence in 2019, with the first launch planned for 2021.

Good afternoon everybody,

Following his request, we had a quick call with David Mitchell of the Nova Scotia Department of Business in order to understand what he is working on, what he wants from the GOC and then involve you all.

The Major Projects Coordination Initiative in which he is affiliated reports to the DM who has asked that major projects in the province be identified.

The Canso spaceport project is one in which he focuses on, particularly its land/terrestrial components and relevant regulators. So far, he is in touch with Transport Canada (a Jason Flanagan will provide him with contacts) and DFO. The movement of hazardous goods and their storage are also elements.

We explained the lack of a comprehensive space legislation and the various OGDs/agencies that have a say/interest in space launch. For GAC, its terrestrial role would be confined to negotiating a TSA if there is US technology transferred to operate the spaceport. David acknowledges that the launch aspect is separate, but expressed a willingness to bring both sides together, so that both federal and provincial regulators are kept abreast of developments with MLS.

For this project, there are three types of meetings:

- (1) One-window meeting with Proponent. This happens annually but will increase as the project progresses. He has a meeting scheduled with Steve Matier on September 17 to discuss milestones*. David offered to report back. He is also open to any suggestions on how WE may be able to input into the discussions.
- (2) One-window meeting of Proponent with provincial regulators.
- (3) One-window meeting of regulators to discuss specific issues concerning the Proponent

Next Steps:

- Let me know if you have any comments on the above report.
- We suggest to arrange a follow up call with David to share more information from your respective sides. Would end of next week work for you?

*MLS is currently engaged in substantive work to meet the conditions of Nova Scotia Environment following approval of its EA. MLS is also engaged in seeking a Crown land lease, which may have its own terms and conditions. To date, breaking ground is expected around Spring 2020, with first launch around 2022.
