5 States of Communication

In communication, speed isn't the bottleneck. Quality is.

Good communicators think about what state of communication they're in and recognize the role they play in helping the communication move through states.











Transmitted

Received

Understood

Agreed



Most people assume they've communicated when they TRANSMIT, but there are 4 other states!



You said something. Doesn't mean they heard it!



He opened your doc. Doesn't mean he understood it!



She responded to your email. Doesn't mean she agreed with you!



You all agreed. Doesn't mean anyone knows what the next steps are!



If you're noticing communication breakdown, it can be useful to check your assumptions and identify where the breakdown may be happening.

Remember that in back-and-forth conversations, you're likely moving through these states quite quickly!
