Position Responsibilities:

Crew members will disassemble building structures applying established deconstruction techniques including performing surface and structural salvage, handling recycling and waste materials, and preparing and loading salvaged materials for hauling.

Other tasks include:

- Looking after the organization's tools and equipment.
- Participating in daily safety meetings and following safety policies and procedures.
- Following supervisory directions.
- Maintaining a safe, clean, and orderly worksite.



Qualifications:

- Work collaboratively with team members, leads, and other personnel onsite.
- Attention to detail and safety.
- Able to work in all outdoor elements and conditions.
- Ability to wear required personal protective equipment - hard hat, safety glasses, hard-toed and soled boots, gloves, ear protection, and a respirator, when required.
- Experience using hand and power tools.
- Some experience in the construction/building industry (i.e.: volunteer, past employment, DIY, etc.)
- Reliability and punctuality.
- Reliable transportation to and from the job site.
- Ability to lift and manipulate material up to 60 lbs throughout the workday.
- Perform repetitive physical work and conduct repeated movement, including standing, walking, bending, prying, stooping carrying, and other related tasks throughout an 8-hour workday.
