Untrammelled. Epic in scale. Greenland is the largest island on Earth. The rocky coastline, if stretched out like a string, would measure 24,430 miles (39,330 kilometers), approximately the circumference of Earth at the Equator. Here hardy Inuit communities perch on the edge of the massive Greenland ice cap, pursuing a timeless way of life. Pack ice and bergs, calved from the monumental Illulissat Glacier, jostle in the waterways. And beckoning fjords fringe Greenland's western coast, as inviting to explorer yachting as any geography on the planet.

In spring from April to May, from powder to corn, these protected fjords offer unparalleled access to prime heli-ski terrain.

No lift, no lines. Ski from summit to sea on wide, treeless snowfields and down steep couloirs flanking glacier-sculpted peaks. Carve tracks where few have or will – from heights overlooking iceberg-choked bays and granite landscapes some 3.8 billion years old.

MV Nansen Explorer is the launchpad for a next level backcountry experience.

Originally designed as an Arctic research vessel, *MV Nansen Explorer* is now an industry first, bridging the gap between *super yacht* and *expedition ship*. With an Ice-1A class hull, *Nansen Explorer* can venture deeper into polar ice than other yachts. Her rugged exteriors, like the badges on a polar explorer's parka, are her bona fides. And following her extensive 2021 refit, calibrated to please the most discerning of clients, her refined interiors reveal a yacht soul.


Nansen Explorer is owned and operated by Nansen Polar Expeditions for private charter. However, thanks to the exclusive management partnership with EYOS, who pioneered 'single cabin' departures aboard superyachts, *Nansen Explorer* can also offer individuals the intimate experience of Greenland yacht owners enjoy: to be alone in one of the most beautiful, remote places on Earth, with extraordinary heli skiing, too.

Equipped with an expansive heli-deck, onboard refuelling capabilities, plus Mk V Zodiacs, kayaks, and SUPs, Nansen Explorer offers ample opportunities to explore. And among her amenities: a lower-level gym; and the Bridge above, where her officers welcome guests.



Nansen Explorer's retrofit opened up the interior of the ship, transforming a warren of rooms into generously proportioned, gracious common areas and only 7 cabins. Luminous, with expansive windows fostering a connection to the views outside, the interior design is inspired by the polar palette: the slate grey of Arctic waters. The pewter of whales. The grounding browns of ancient bedrock. And the tawny gold of sunsets on soaring peaks.

Elegantly appointed in a simple Scandinavian style, her lounge is welcoming and relaxing. And each day her dining room, where the expert culinary team offers a varied menu and superb cuisine, sets the scene for camaraderie and congenial conversation.





HELI-SKI EXPEDITION IN GREENLAND

Please note that this is a yacht expedition, designed for flexibility and spontaneity. The actual day-by-day itinerary will be determined by your Captain & Expedition Guide according to weather conditions in the region and the group's preferences. We have indicated some highlights and opportunities likely on your expedition

Day 1: Arrive in Greenland at the international airport at Kangerlussuaq, the main air hub in Greenland and the only airport in west Greenland suitable for jet aircraft. The airport dates from American settlement during and after World War II, when the site was known as Bluie West-8 and Sondrestrom Air Base.


Transfer to your scheduled Air Greenland flight to Sisimiut, a charming community whose name means “inhabitants by the fox burrows,” to meet Nansen Explorer.

The yacht will disembark Sisimiut and conditions permitting, head south to Maniitsoq for heli skiing in virgin backcountry.

Days 2-8: The yacht will station in the Maniitsoq region where a network of fjords allows us scenic variety and access to mountains rising some 500-1000 meters straight from the sea. The scenery is spectacular—with breath-taking views of glaciers and the sea; you may even spot feeding whales as you ski down. And the terrain is superb, offering wide, treeless expanses and exhilarating descents. The long days of Arctic summer and great snow conditions—this expedition is scheduled in prime season—will likely keep us in the region. But there is the option to venture away from Maniitsoq to explore the Sisimiut area, or to head further north to iceberg-choked Disko Bay for scenic cruising.

In between runs or in lieu of skiing for those inclined, the expedition team can arrange flight seeing, hiking, fjord kayaking or Zodiac cruising in the peerless late-evening Arctic light, or to a local village for cultural encounters.

Day 9: Disembark Nansen Explorer at Sisimiut, and transfer to your scheduled Greenland Air flight to the international airport at Kangerlussuaq for flights home.





ACCOMMODATIONS

Originally designed to carry 60 passengers, *Nansen Explorer* now carries only 12 guests in modern, spacious cabins, refined in a simple Scandinavian style. Generous floor to ceiling windows frame beautiful views, fostering a connection to the world outside the yacht. And soft textures, crisp linens and deluxe bedding restore body and soul.
