# **Election Code Update**

Attention all Skowkale Community Members,

October 23, 2024, the Skowkale Executive Director received a petition with 62 member signatures requesting an amendment to the Skowkale Election Code. The requested amendment was specifically related to family representatives being voted for solely by their family members during times that multiple representatives have been nominated.

# In the current election code, the amendment clause states in section 35:

- 1. Amendment proposals shall be in writing and delivered to the Sq'ewqéyl Manager and must be accompanied by a petition showing support from at least 30% of the eligible electorate.
- 2. The Sq'ewqéyl Manager shall commence amending procedures within 10 days of receiving the written proposal.
- 3. The Sq'ewqéyl election regulations may be amended after:
  - a. Notice is given to the Sq'ewqéyl members that an amendment has been proposed, and
  - b. Consultation with the Sq'ewqéyl members specifically to discuss the amendment proposal has occurred, 14 days after the notice, and
  - c.Support from at least 50%+1 of the present eligible electorate of the Sq'ewqéyl First Nation has been achieved in a referendum held specifically for that purpose. A referendum shall be held within 30 days of the consultation meeting.

# Requested amendment was specifically related to family representatives:

### 10.SELECTION OF COUNCILLORS

- 1.At the nomination meeting, eligible electorate will nominate eligible members from their ancestral family one of the Archie, Hall, Point, Sepass families;
- 2.If only one (1) is nominated in a family, they are elected by acclamation;
- 3.If more than one (1) member is nominated, their names will be entered on a family specific election ballot (pending acceptance) under the applicable family;
- 4. Nominees will have until 25 days before the election date to withdraw from the election and be removed from the ballot;
- 5.All eligible electors of the Sq'ewqéyl First Nation will by secret ballot choose a Councilor in their own Family grouping. The candidate with the highest number of votes in that Family will be declared the Councilor/Representative of that Family and for the Sq'ewqéyl First Nation.

The Amendment Section in the Election Code indicates that once the Executive Director receives that petition, there must be a notice to membership and then a meeting called within 14 days before a referendum is held within 30 days.

# **LANDS Stewardship Team**

"We are Water Protectors" is now on the trail. This beautiful book is written by Carole Lindstorm and illustrated by Michaela Goade.

"We are Water Protectors" is about protecting the environment and being stewards of the land. Being a steward of the land, you take care of all things that use it. The story starts at the beginning of the trail across from The'í:tselíya.

Carole Lindstorm is Anishinaabe/ Metis and an enrolled member of the Turtle Mountain Band of Ojibwe, and her tribal homelands are in Belcourt, North Dakota.

Michaela Goade is a member of the Tlingit and Haida tribes in Alaska. She also illustrated "I Sang You Down from the Stars," the previous book that was on the trail.









The Land Stewardship Department has planted over 7,000 trees and shrubs this month including some 4.5m tall Douglas Fir trees along Chilliwack Creek to improve wildlife habitat and increase shade for the stream benefiting Chum and Coho salmon. Many volunteer groups have helped including the Seabird Island Guardians, local businesses, DFO, Provincial staff, and school classes.

A new cantilevered viewing platform, made from Yellow Cedar, was recently completed using grant funding. The platform over Chilliwack Creek is a great spot to watch the returning Chum salmon in the creek right now!





#### S.A.Y. Homeowner Grant



#### **Guiding Principle:**

Skowkale, Aitchelitz and Yakweakwioose are First Nations addressing the housing gap for Indigenous people in their community. Efforts are to be made to support their members in subsidizing the cost of construction for their homes within the community.

#### Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to provide a Homeowner Grant as a one-time only subsidy program that reduces the cost of construction for a member building their own home in community. This is made possible through the Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF) at CMHC.

#### Scope

This policy applies to all members of Skowkale, Aitchelitz and Yakweakwioose that have met the requirements to construct a family home on their respective community lands and request financial assistance.


#### Procedures:

- 1) Amount
  - a. Subsidies are available in the amount of \$20,666
- 2) Availability
  - a. These funds are available for the 2024-2025 fiscal year only
  - There are six (6) subsidies available in Skowkale, five (5) in Aitchelitz and four
     (4) in Yakweakwioose
- 3) Application
  - Members must submit a written request for the funds to the housing department and include, in writing:
    - i. Confirmation of land allocation; and
    - ii. Confirmation of financing; and
    - iii. Confirmation of membership; and
    - iv. Construction timeline.






