Consent Agenda Approval	The minutes of the in-person Colorado Board meeting held on April 16, 2024 (Meeting #17) were adopted without objection.		
Colorado Updates Discussion	P. Hargreave reported on amendments made by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE) to the proposed rules based on the Board's comments. It was noted that the formal rulemaking hearing will be held on May 21, 2024. The Board agreed CAA should register to participate in the hearing.		
	An update on workstreams for the Colorado Program Plan development was shared with the Colorado Board.		
	An update on the Advisory Board's meeting agenda and the feedback about the tentative nature of the agenda was noted.		
	Discussion then focused on using the Needs Assessment as the basis for beginning to consult and provide recommendations to CDPHE on the list of covered materials, the minimum recyclables list, targets for proposed collection and recycling rates as well as for minimum levels of post-consumer-recycled-content rates for 2030 and 2035 as part of the program, development of rules for tracking and verifying adherence to the target rates, and any framework that should be used for considering exemptions and waivers from the targets.		
Other Business	Media coverage regarding the Joint Budget Committee's decision was highlighted.		
	<ul> <li>CalRecycle's request to discuss the Colorado Needs Assessment methodology, data gathering, and lessons learned in advance of California's Needs Assessment was noted.</li> <li>S. Buckingham noted that he would provide an update to both the CA and CO Boards post-meeting.</li> </ul>		
	Draft revisions to the Needs Assessment based on CDPHE's feedback are pending final review before sharing with CDPHE for further evaluation.		
	The Colorado Board briefly discussed whether the May 27 <sup>th</sup> meeting would proceed due to the Memorial Day holiday. The Board Chair suggested to wait until after the May 8 <sup>th</sup> Board meeting and CO ED decision before a decision is made on how to proceed.

## Antitrust Compliance

Circular Action Alliance is subject to federal, state, and international antitrust/competition laws and has a policy of strict compliance with these laws, without exception.

These antitrust laws prohibit competitors from engaging in actions that could result in an unreasonable restraint of trade.

Consequently, competitors must avoid discussing certain topics when they are together, meeting virtually, or at any other time: prices, fees, rates, profit margins, discounts, promotions, rebates, or other terms or conditions of sale; pricing strategies, methods, trends, plans, or timing of price changes; salaries, costs, and other factors that affect pricing; the hiring or recruitment of other members' employees; allocation of markets or customers or division of territories; topics that may lead participants to not deal with or to boycott a particular supplier, customer, or third party; reductions of output; bid-rigging; or any other anti-competitive topics or actions.

Failure to comply with these antitrust laws will not be tolerated in any manner.
