As teachers are learning and growing professionally, their students directly benefit as they grow academically. With you in her corner, 4th grade teacher Gretchen Biere has done just this. And her students can't stop smiling.

Gretchen, a 2017 MTR and 2022 Reading Specialist graduate explains, "My time there was amazing. The training I received affirmed the values I already had and paired them with the pedagogy, best practices, and science of teaching and reading that I needed.

"Teaching reading used to feel like casting a wide net and hoping to catch some fish." But these days when she thinks of how much she's improved, her face lights up. "The training enabled me to apply what I'd just learned right away. This directly impacted what and how my students learned the next day. It's made all the difference."

When Ivan first arrived in Gretchen's classroom, "he hardly ever smiled." It was clear right away that for Ivan, school was a gauntlet of confusion, frustration, and failure. Gretchen could literally feel his pain by osmosis. But she lived her values faithfully. She believed in Ivan with all her heart.

By the end of the school year, Ivan was a different person. His reading, writing, and math skills had all markedly improved. "There's this one picture of Ivan at the end of the year. He's beaming with pride. I love it. It makes me so happy."





Thanks to you, every year, more and more people like Gretchen are entering the world of teaching. And more and more children like Ivan are reaching their full potential.

"It's really powerful," Gretchen says.

"Ivan believes in himself now. Every kid deserves that."

Zach Villegas—a fourth grade teacher at Berclair Elementary School in Memphis—is not the type to brag. He speaks of others' strengths. He expresses gratitude for his success as an MTR graduate now beginning his first year as a mentor teacher to an MTR resident.

So when Zach talks of crushing it, he's referring to his mentee: current MTR resident Misty Metcalf, who spends four days a week in Zach's classroom as part of her internship. "Misty is awesome," Zach says. "I'm so happy for her. Just today, she led a lesson, and it was really cool to see the growth she's made in only two weeks in the classroom."

Becoming a teacher was never a clear path for Zach. But once he found himself living in Memphis and volunteering with children, something clicked. Since then, your generous support has been a guiding force on his journey from novice to expert... from MTR resident to MTR mentor.

"I was surprised by the culture of encouragement at MTR," Zach explains. "Everyone here is incredibly supportive, and that's made a huge difference. I keep this in mind with my students. Believing in them is a powerful thing. And they deserve it."

After four years of teaching, Zach feels competent enough to take on the role of a mentor. "It's been great," he says of mentoring Misty. "She's come so far already. I'm really proud of her."
