The CHPS Minor Renovations Program

The Collaborative for High Performance Schools (CHPS) is launching a new program to address schools' most pressing facility improvement needs in a manner that is grounded in positive student outcomes thanks to the support of our government partner Sourcewell, and participation by the Los Angeles Unified School District and Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District.

We're looking for partners to join us in developing this transformative program designed to complete renovations at schools across the country according to interdisciplinary best practices that ensure all students have equitable access to better indoor environments.

Meeting an Urgent Need

It's estimated that 53% of America's public schools need to invest in repairs, renovations, and modernizations, yet upgrades are not getting done at the rate or scale needed to provide safe and productive learning environments for students. Although smaller renovation projects represent the majority of districts' facility expenditures, a set of industry-aligned best practices does not exist to enable effective planning and implementation.

Why CHPS?

For 20 years, CHPS has developed and maintained the nation's only third-party building standard explicitly designed and exclusively for K-12 schools grounded in student performance. Today, we are evolving to meet the growing needs of our students and their schools – and this program, an iteration of current CHPS criteria, is an important pillar of our new vision to make better school design the rule, not the exception.

How it works

CHPS is building a cohort of industry experts and founding members including building scientists, health and safety representatives, leading manufacturers, consultants, service providers, architects, engineers, educators, utilities, and school district personnel. Together, they will define criteria based on industry best practices, and launch proof of concept projects starting with facility improvements that are proven to yield the most positive outcomes including improved air quality, lighting quality, and thermal comfort.
