Biographical Note

Gamaliel Bradford VI was an internationally acclaimed biographer and author; he wrote poetry, fiction, drama, literary criticism, as well as non-fiction. Bradford was generally considered "one of the leading biographical writers ever produced in America," (Warren, 9) and was often called the "Dean of American biographers" (Warren, 9). While he saw himself as a dramatist, poet and novelist, he acknowledged that his blossoming as a biographer seemed almost an accident (Warren, 9).

Bradford was a direct descendent of Plymouth Colony Governor William Bradford. Born in Boston on October 9, 1863, he was the son of noted banker Gamaliel Bradford V and Clara Crowninshield (Kinsman) Bradford. The family moved to 493 Worcester Street in Wellesley Hills two years later; his mother died soon after the move. Bradford lived at 493 Worcester Street until his death On April 11, 1932. He married Helen Hubbard Ford in 1886; they had two children, Gamaliel Bradford VII, who died young, and Sarah Rice Bradford.

Bradford suffered from ill health his entire life, with a variety of symptoms including sensitivity to light, vertigo, headaches, and general fatigue. Because of his lifelong illness, he attended Wellesley schools sporadically, and was educated predominantly by private tutors; as a young man he often travelled in Europe with his father. He noted, "I educated myself by vast, vague, utterly erratic reading. As I used to put it, not unfairly, I was educated by ill health and a vagrant imagination" (Warren, 10). Bradford attended Harvard University with the class of 1886, but did

not take a degree. Much of his early life growing up in Wellesley is recounted in *Early Days in Wellesley*, published in 1928.

Though he wrote voluminously in many genres, Bradford is best known for over 100 biographies, many of which are still in print. His approach to biography was unconventional for the time, and he was a pioneer in trying to understand the psychology and motivations of his subjects, rather than just their actions. He called his biographies "psychographs," and discussed his method in *Naturalist of Souls: Studies in Psychography*. "His preoccupation with the souls of human beings and his aim to dissect them with the scientific precision of a surgeon," one writer has noted, allowed readers to "learn more of the essential qualities" of character (Warren, 14).

Some of his notable psychographs include *Lee the American, Darwin, Dwight L. Moody*, and *The Soul of Samuel Pepys*. Many of his collections of short psychographs were published together, and included *Union Portraits*; *Confederate Portraits*; *Portraits of Women*; *American Portraits*, 1875-1900; *Damaged Souls*; and *The Quick and the Dead*.

In his civic life, Bradford took a keen interest in Wellesley, and served several terms on the school board; he was interested in both Wellesley academics as well as school sports. The high school on Rice Street, prior to the current building, was known as the Gamaliel Bradford Senior High School. It was built in 1938 and was replaced by the current facilities. He was also first president of the Maugus Club (Bolton, 6).

Despite often debilitating illness, Bradford was known as a genial and generous man, often hosting young authors and artists in his home. "There was a poise and self-control that invited confidences," one observer wrote, noting that "his personal philosophy is expressed all throughout his works. He was ever trying to answer the great riddles of life" (Bolton, 11).

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains a variety of materials pertaining to the life of Gamaliel Bradford VI and members of his family. Printed materials include writings published by Bradford in various literary journals, several of his books, as well as biographies and memorials written about Bradford following his death in 1932; additionally, the collection contains reviews of Bradford's writings by his contemporaries.

In addition to literary works, the collection contains scrapbooks with photographs, journals, a small collection of correspondence.

The collection contains two journals in which Bradford tracked his daily reading, including books and periodicals. The two journals cover the period roughly 1900 - 1924.

Also of interest are two scrapbooks, both containing photographs and newspaper clippings. The first was assembled by Gamaliel Bradford VI commemorating the death of his father in 1911. The second was created as a memorial by Harriet Crouch, and documents elements of Bradford's life and career. The latter contains nine photographs of Bradford's home, personal library, and workspace.

In addition to the Gamaliel Bradford VI materials, the collection contains a series of family-related papers and documents, from Gamaliel Bradford III (1763 – 1824); Gamaliel Bradford IV (1795 – 1839); Bradford's wife Helen Ford Bradford, and their daughter Sara Bradford Ross. Included with these materials are published memorials about Gamaliel Bradford V (1831 – 1911).

Many of the journal, newspaper, and periodical articles in Series I: Printed Materials: Literary works by Gamaliel Bradford VI and Series VII: Printed Materials: Works about Gamaliel Bradford VI, by other authors, are archival photocopies of the published originals.
