## METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted August 17 – 18, 2023, with 414 likely 2024 general election voters. It has a margin of error of  $\pm 4.72\%$ . Known registered voters were interviewed via live calls and SMS. This survey was weighted to a likely 2024 general election voter universe.
