





- Economically vulnerable voters turn to populist parties after austerity (IPES 2021)

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LEFT: clear anti-austerity position; variation over trade

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- (newer lit.) strategic and sharpening of economic positions; welfare chauvinism

- DIRECT POLICY EFFECT: reverse austerity, redistribute towards losers; roll back globalization, protect domestic jobs
- INDIRECT POLICY EFFECT: repositioning of mainstream parties
- UNRELATED TO POLICY: 2<sup>nd</sup> dimension voting, protest, anger ...



GOAL: assess perceptions and policy expectations about parties

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COUNTRIES: Germany, Portugal, Spain, United Kingdom

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 ${\rm SAMPLE:} \qquad \textit{N} = 2000 \text{ per country}$ 

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COUNTRIES: Germany, Portugal, Spain, United Kingdom

SAMPLE: N = 2000 per country

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OWN POSITIONS: left-right; spending (overall); immigration



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
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
DISTRICT: net emigration; income per capita; foreigners




# IMPORTANCE OF PARTY POSITION FOR VOTE















# Spending Expectations, by Left-Right



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## CONCLUSION

### FINDINGS

- Spending important for vote, also for radical right voters
- Vulnerable voters expect little support, and the least from radical right party
- No effect of community-level vulnerability measures
- Expectations vary between left and right voters



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#### IMPLICATIONS

- Turn to radical parties is motivated by economic policy considerations
- Political cleavage by ideology, not socio-economic characteristics
