


## Findings & Contribution

#### Negative trade exposure...


- Does lead to less favorable free trade attitudes—but so do elite cues
- Does not determine one's vote it's party identification
- Individuals from a panel survey across three elections



# Results: Exposure and Attitudes

Relationship between exposure and attitudes

"Exposure" = logged TAA applications within 200 miles over preceding four months



#### Two-Wave Test (Lenz, 2013)

$$pref_{i,2016} = \alpha_g + \beta_1 pref_{i,2011} + \beta_2 vote_{i,2012} + \varepsilon_i$$

$$vote_{i,2016} = \alpha_g + \rho_1 vote_{i,2012} + \rho_2 pref_{i,2011} + \varepsilon_i$$


#### Are trade attitudes correlated with vote?

Opposition to trade and GOP support Increasingly strong associations over time

#### Are votes correlated with trade attitude?

GOP Support and opposition to trade Increasingly strong associations over time

#### Are attitudes or votes more predictive?



 Trade attitudes are a result of people's vote intentions and exposure

- The role of organized interests and political entrepreneurship within the place
- Repercussions for trade policy and international cooperation and conflict
