Adopt National Policy Framework & Implementing Guidance Governments should adopt policies establishing clear authorities, 01 responsibilities, guidance, resources, and accountability for the prevention, mitigation, and response to civilian harm. **Model International Leadership** 02

Countries should support civilian harm mitigation and protection at the UN & other multilateral institutions. They should also ratify and implement relevant international law sources and support the work of treaty-based and regional human rights bodies that focus on the

protection of civilians in conflict.

03

Support Oversight Countries and their security institutions should cooperate with oversight bodies to ensure they operate lawfully and are held accountable for their conduct and the provision of security services.

04

Adopt POC Legislation

Legislative bodies should promote the protection of civilians by calling on executive counterparts to prevent, minimize, and address harm using legislative oversight, laws, and allocate necessary resources.


Prioritize Civilian Harm Mitigation in Military Planning

Countries and their armed forces should prioritize the prevention, minimization, and response to civilian harm in military planning and preparation, and communicate guidance in clear language through doctrine and orders. Armed forces should be trained accordingly.

Explosive Weapons in Populated Areas

Countries should restrict or refrain from using explosive weapons in populated areas as called for in the <u>Political Declaration</u> on strengthening the protection of civilians from the humanitarian consequences arising from the use of EWIPA.

08

Adopt an Approach to Investigate & Track **Civilian Harm**

Countries and armed forces should institute comprehensive measures to track and investigate civilian harm resulting from their actions.

09

Adopt Amends Policy

Countries should adopt post-harm amendment policies that include contrition, consultations with those affected, and contextually appropriate and victim-centered forms of assistance.

10

Support Relationships

Government policies and practices should ensure that support relationships (including arms sales, security assistance, and partnered operations) reinforce measures to prevent, mitigate, and address civilian harm.
