War-time perceptions in the West Bank – Palestine

3-9 May 2025



Context

- The return of the war in Gaza and continued Israeli aggression in the West Bank are devastating the lives of Palestinians in the occupied territories. As regional and international efforts to establish a ceasefire and plan for what comes next, it is crucial to amplify Palestinian voices on issues that will shape their lives for years to come.
- The Institute for Social and Economic Progress (ISEP) commissioned and conducted a representative poll in the West Bank (including East Jerusalem) between 3 9 May, 2025.
- Some findings of this research are contingent on the events that are still unfolding and might change over the course of the war or after.

Executive summary (1/3)

- This report is made of seven sections, together composing a comprehensive picture of the Palestinian West Bank public's take on the political reality of the day as well as worries, hopes, and expectations for the future:
 - Section (1) feelings and perceptions during the war
 - Section (2) perceptions of the Palestinian Authority role
 - Section (3) support/ opposition for various national leaders
 - > Section (4) preferences for different systems of government
 - Section (5) examines attitudes towards the situation in Gaza and post war rule
 - > Section (6) views on emigration and international actors
 - > Section (7) assesses support for solutions and strategies for national liberation

Executive summary – main findings (2/3)

- Helplessness, anger, and hatred are the dominant emotions in the West Bank; strong positive emotions are felt strongly by 1 in 3.
- Two in five in the West Bank do not know the name of the Prime Minister, and over 40% are completely dissatisfied with the performance of the government.
- Marwan Barghouthi remains the most popular national figure in the West Bank, and the only leader supported by the majority. Mustafa Barghouthi is also popular among a significant minority.
- The recent appointment of Hussein Al Sheikh as Vice President is unpopular, mainly due to perceived the "undemocratic" nature of the move.


Executive summary – main findings (3/3)

- In an upcoming election, independents would secure just under a third of the vote; support for Fatah has dropped to its lowest point in years.
- Most West Bank Palestinians would choose secular over religious rule but many could accept to live under either. A majority sees no contradiction between Islam and democracy.
- Despite hardships, most Palestinians prefer to remain in their homeland, but those who would emigrate, favor either Canada, Turkey, or the US.
- Around 50% have heard of France's declaration to recognize Palestine as a state, which may explain the improvement in her popularity.



Sample distribution - Gender and age


Sample distribution

By Gender





 - ♦ Stratified random sampling




Psychology of war

Feelings and collective hope

Helplessness is the leading emotion among respondents in the West Bank, followed by anger and hatred

In the current situation, to what extent do you feel the following emotions?




As more time passed without an end to the war, hopes for a closer end to the occupation have significantly declined



Who is the current Palestinian Prime Minister?




Two in five are dissatisfied with the performance of the current government, and 1 in 5 rate government performance as average


Just over half (56%) of respondents have heard of Hussein Al-Sheikh's appointment as vice president at the end of April

Have you heard about the appointment of Hussein Sheikh as Vice President?




Of those, a large majority (73%) is dissatisfied with the decision


How satisfied are you with the decision to appoint him?



Dissatisfied respondents cite the 'undemocratic' nature of the appointment as the leading cause for their disapproval


If you are dissatisfied, why?

How much do you oppose or support these leaders in a post-war referendum?




Governance preferences



How much do you oppose or support the following solutions in the post-war referendum?




In the event of serious negotiations, would you accept a state on the 1967 borders with Jerusalem as the capital?



Additionally there has been an increase in support for the one state solution


How much do you oppose or support the following solutions in the post-war referendum?

One state where Palestinians and Jews enjoy equal rights and freedoms




...willingness to accept the one state solution has also been steadily increasing

To what degree do you believe each of the following actions can achieve positive results concerning the Palestinian struggle for liberation?







Expectations for governance, aid, and political transition

How likely are the following scenarios when it comes to the future of the West Bank?









There has been an increase in respondents believing that the war will end with the PA taking over the Gaza Strip

In your opinion, what is the most likely outcome of the war in the Gaza Strip?




...and monetary aid continues to be perceived as the most effective measure to help Gaza Palestinians

How effective are the following measures when it comes to helping people in Gaza?




The overwhelming majority (75.2%) believe that Hamas should accept a ceasefire only if it is permanent

Regarding war negotiations, should Hamas accept a temporary truce?




Two in three (68.8%) would support a unity government to rule the Gaza Strip post war


If a transitional period is approved in Gaza after the end of the war, who will you choose to govern Gaza?



Half of respondents believe that Gazans have superhuman abilities when it comes to endurance and resilience




...and the grand majority (64.3%) believe that Hamas should not surrender their arms at any cost




...and over half believe the status of Palestinians will get worse on all fronts in the 5 coming years


To what degree do you think the status of Palestinians will improve or worsen in the 5 years to come on the following fronts?

Around half of respondents are willing to take personal risks for the sake of the cause




International affairs

Views on the roles of international actors and appetite for immigration


The West's role is viewed negatively, but countries with a history of supporting the Palestinian cause are viewed more favourably

Evaluate the role of the following countries regarding the Palestinian issue




Half (50.6%) are aware of France's declared intention to recognise Palestine as a state

Have you heard about France's intention to recognize Palestine in the coming months?




A majority in the West Bank state that they would continue living in Palestine even if given the opportunity to immigrate

Conclusions

- A majority of West Bank Palestinians expect the PA the continue to exist in the upcoming decade but are dissatisfied with its "undemocratic" decision-making.
- A significant minority (2 in 5) are unaware of who the Prime Minister is and have not heard of Hussein Al-Sheikh's appointment, which may be due to under-communication between the government and the public.
- In a future election, the biggest camp of voters would support independence, and Fateh's popularity is at an all times low.
- A majority of West Bank Palestinians (68%) would not leave the country even if the had an opportunity to emigrate; around 20% wish to emigrate and another 12% are unsure.
- → Half of West Bank respondent are aware of France's intention to recognize Palestine in the near future, which may explain improvement in her image.



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
