LANHYDROK

Lanhydrok is 13 miles east of Rosewyn near Bodmin. The property is National Trust and in fact the jewel in their crown. Note that the gardens are closed for the winter and open on 1 March 2024. The estate extends to some 900 acres and there are many footpaths and cycle tracks, together with a good cafe and the usual shop.

In the summer you can arrive by steam on the Bodmin & Wengford Railway which operates out of Bodmin.

TRETRICE

Only 5 miles away heading towards Newquay.

An Elizabethan house and gardens which date back to 1572.

Note that the property is closed until 24 February 2024.

The house is probably 50 years older than Rosewyn but it is a bit more imposing and you can take a tour of the house which is well worth the visit.

There is an apple orchard of Cornish varieties, a Parade Ground and a picnic lawn in addition to the shop!



TRELISSICK

10 miles from Rosewyn on the way from Truro to Falmouth.

Trelissick is also a National Trust property.

It includes a large house and gardens as well as parkland which extends down to the Fal Estuary.

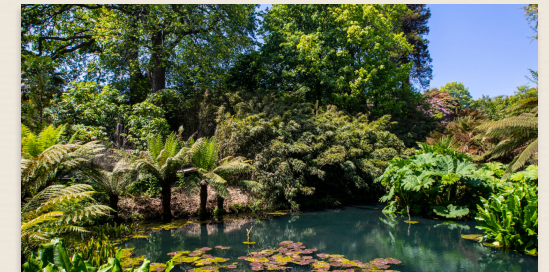
There is good walking to do to including a long walk around the estate and down to the King Harry Ferry which crosses over the Fal where it is still 90 feet deep despite being 10 miles or so upstream.

EDEN PROJECT
