TRACKING VISITOR USE AT BLACK ROCK MOUNTAIN BIKE AREA



DF and SFTO teamed up with Oregon State University and the University of Washington, to try out new ways to track visitor activity at Rock Mountain Bike Area (BRMBA). This vear-long study gave us important info on who's using the trails, what they're doing, how it affects their health, and the economic boost it brings to nearby communities. Now, we're aiming to do similar research at more recreation spots in state forests

LEADING THE WAY IN RECREATION

eople of color have long enjoyed outdoor recreation in the United States, from before the creation of National Parks to today. However. they have also experienced treatment. racism, bigotry, and threats, leaving many feeling vulnerable and wary spending time recreating in public lands meant for all. To help promote how people of color can feel safe and welcome while recreating state forests. **SFTO** commissioned filmmaker photographer, Brown, to create an exhibit highlighting people of color who find joy and healing in nature and foster the outdoor recreationist community. This exhibit will open May 18. 2024 at the Tillamook Forest Center (TFC), with a special presentation on June 15. 2024.

SANTIAM STATE FOREST TREE PLANTING



ollowing the devastating 2020 Labor Day fires, generous donations from Oregonians helped ODF plant 46 acres of the Fern Ridge Project Area. This initiative aims to explore various methods for restoring forests after wildfires. Additionally, ODF and SFTO engaged 70 students from the Career Technical Education Center to participate in replanting, fostering a legacy of community support for the Santiam State Forest.


DONORS CELEBRATE TILLAMOOK FOREST CENTER REOPENING
