

Boebert Disappoints

Colorado Congresswoman Lauren Boebert's announcement that she is jumping Congressional Districts is a disappointing surprise to say the least. Her self-serving bid to hold on to power guarantees CD3 will now go to a Democrat or a UniParty Republican In Name Only.

Boebert is abandoning her constituents in CD3 to seek the GOP nomination in CD4, which opened up after Rep. Ken Buck decided to not seek reelection.

Boebert tried to justify her move saying, "Personally this announcement is a fresh start following a difficult year for me and my family. I will not allow dark money that is directed at me to steal this seat. It's not fair to the 3rd District and the conservatives there who have fought so hard for our victories, of which I'm incredibly grateful."

To be sure, Boebert was looking at a tough fight in CD3, attacked on all sides, from Democrats who were pouring millions into their effort to take the District and by Establishment Republicans determined to oust America First candidates like Boebert.

The usual Establishment suspects, like former Governor Bill Owens and former Colorado Springs Mayor John Suthers have been putting their money and their mouths behind RINO candidate Jeff Hurd.

If Boebert managed to beat Hurd for the GOP nomination, she was looking at a brutal general election battle. In 2022, she beat Democrat Adam Frisch by just 546 votes. The Democrats are pulling out all the stops to help Frisch beat her in 2024. He's raised more than \$8.6 million dollars so far, while Boebert has only \$1.4 million on hand.

But the going has never been easy for grassroots and many are disappointed Boebert is giving up on CD3. Colorado Republican Party Chair Dave Williams was caught by surprise like everyone else and says, "She is clearly concerned about losing to Jeff Hurd or Adam Frisch and is doing whatever she can to keep her seat in Congress – while jeopardizing our ability to retain Congressional District 3 as well as our slim majority in the U.S. House of Representatives. There were many Republicans counting on her in CD3 and they were let down today."

Political analysts are mixed on what this means for Republicans in CD3. Some say Boebert just handed the Democrats a victory while other say it is Boebert voters don't like and believe a Republican can win there as long as Boebert is not the candidate. One thing is certain, we will now hear the usual calls for unity to come from RINOs supporting Hurd.

Either way, grassroots conservatives lose. Boebert had her issues, but at least she was an America First candidate. Now voters will get either a Democrat or a Uniparty RINO.

And Boebert, meanwhile carpet bags her way from the Western Slope to the Front Range.
