



# 7 FREE TODDLER ACTIVITIES in Reading

Get active and have fun on the slide in the soft play area at Parkside Cafe on rainy days. The staff are lovely, the coffee is good and there are often friendly parents to chat to.

Pop along to Waterstones on Broad Street for an informal storytime in their revamped children's book section, complete with toddler seating area.

Check out the play area at the Atrium Cafe on Friar Street. Enjoy a coffee while your little one is busy exploring new toys. It's a great place to meet other parents informally too.

Visit the chickens, play on the wooden tractor and explore the wildflower garden at the Museum of English Rural Life on Redlands Road.

Pack a picnic and go for a play on the swings in the impressive new playground at Prospect Park.

Drop by a Rhyme Time at a Reading Library for interactive sessions involving singing nursery rhymes, reading stories, and engaging in fun activities that promote early literacy.

Explore the Reading Abbey Quarter. Start with a trip around Reading Museum, then walk through Forbury Gardens and the Abbey Ruins to the Kennet Canal to count the ducks.
