


### The reality – limited crossings and no room!

#### Time and Distance needed to Safely Stop a Light-Rail Train

A train at 25 mph needs up to 6.5 seconds to stop (1.5 seconds is the driver's reaction time), at the specified deceleration rate of -5 miles per hour per second.







# Beltline trees provide vital Eco-Services

- 50,000 tons of CO<sub>2</sub> lifetime carbon reduction
- 9 Million gallons of H2O evapo-transpires per year.
- 9 degrees cooler than surface temperatures
- 200,000 gallons of stormwater absorbed per year
- Bike vs. car saves over 5 tons of CO<sub>2</sub>/year

#### We need a Beltline vision that keeps our canopy



# And these vital projects are losing out

- Hollowell/North Ave. BRT (Marta stations, Beltline crossings)
- Peachtree Buckhead ART (high scoring for access to jobs)
- Northside Drive BRT (congestion commuting corridor)
- Clifton Corridor LRT (10,000 mixed-income workers)
- Station improvements & increased frequencies

... and about 60 other transit projects.

### What we would like to see happen

- An honest analysis of the cost of Rail (with operating costs)
- A City-wide planning process with all options on the table
- A new plan that saves our tree canopy
- A new plan that expands micro-mobility capacity
- A new plan that considers new small transit vehicles
- A new plan that addresses true citywide transit needs today
