Council would also like to welcome the Hub's new facility manager, who is well known amongst the local community - Milpara Community House.

The design and development of the Korumburra Community Hub has taken a lot of discussion, ideas and involvement by many people and organisations within our community and Council would like to thank everyone who has played a role in this project. The facility has been shaped by our community and is expected to service Korumburra for many years to come.

The Korumburra Community Hub was funded by a significant contribution of \$5 million from the Victorian Government's Community Infrastructure Loans Scheme and \$750,000 from the Living Libraries Infrastructure Program. The total project cost was \$7 million which includes Council's contribution of \$1.25 million.



The new building is home to Myli Community Library, Milpara Community House and the Korumburra & District Historical Society. It also features three meeting rooms and a flexi space attached to a small kitchen.

Other projects that are happening or planned for Korumburra include:

- New football and netball changerooms at the Korumburra Showgrounds
- A new car park behind Kelly's Bakery
- A new streetscape for Commercial Street
- A revitalised railway precinct, including a skate park and landscaped area
- A new mural on the building leading to the railway underpass



#### Carinya Aged Care

Since 2006, the Greenhills Community Benevolent Society Inc. has made generous donations totalling approximately \$500,000. These contributions have been instrumental in several significant improvements within the Carinya's facility.

The funds have enabled the construction of an independent living unit, providing residents with more comfortable and self-sufficient living arrangements. Additionally, the society generously contributed to the construction of another independent living unit, further expanding the capacity to serve the community.

But their benevolence extended far beyond just housing. The Greenhills donations reached into the very fabric of Carinya. Upgrades were made to essential equipment, and a fresh look was brought to the old dining area, including new comfortable chairs, tables and floor coverings at that time breathing new life into a space filled with cherished memories.

In a remarkable move in 2014, Greenhills spearheaded the installation and upgrade of solar panels, making Carinya more sustainable and eco-friendly. Since being monitored in February 2022, these panels have already saved Carinya approximately \$45,000, resources that can now be reinvested to enhance the care and comfort of the residents.

To honour this enduring partnership, Carinya has installed plaques throughout the facility. The most recent additions include a room plaque, a plaque on the Community Tree, and the dedication of an entire wing named "Greenhills".

Carinya is forever grateful to have the support of Greenhills and is excited to soon share the plans for the most recent donation made at our recent Annual General Meeting. At this meeting, another \$15,000 has been generously donated, further solidifying the partnership and ensuring that Carinya's mission continues.





#### **Korumburra Horticultural Society**

There are a number of formal and casual garden clubs in our region, most of which celebrate Christmas with a lunch or tea, then take a holiday in January.

Several near-by clubs are affiliated with the Royal Horticultural Society of Victoria-Leongatha, Poowong, Inverloch and San Remo, as is Welshpool. They join for an Annual Regional Conference and some hold yearly flower shows along with regular monthly meetings and occasional spontaneous initiatives.

Here in Korumburra, the agricultural show in early February includes- among its many other attractions- a flower show. Details of 'the Ag Show' will soon start to appear around town.

Then in late March Friends of Korumburra Botanic Park will organise South Gippsland's sixth annual celebration of National Eucalypt Day. The full story of NED 24 will be well covered in March Burra Flyer.

As readers will already know Korumburra Horticultural Society is no longer active, but our remnants hope to meet early next year to organise a memorial tree planting in conjunction with the Botanic Park.

#### **Grow Lightly**

Grow Lightly has been running in Korumburra for over ten years. The main aim is to give people access to high quality local food, through producers who live within a sixty kilometre radius of the town.

Meredith and Gil Freeman, who were awarded OAMs in this year's Australia Day Honours for services to the Community, and their friends Ken and Henry Halasa initiated the concept, and it has evolved and changed through the years, but has always maintained its not-for-profit, local and organic base.

Currently it is run as an online shop with The Food Hub as its centre - not the new one - the small cottage on Silkstone Road, next to Coal Creek Community Park. Customers order online from 2pm each Friday through to 5pm Sunday, with pick up on the following Wednesday. Deliveries are also made to pick up points in Inverloch, Wonthaggi, Loch and fortnightly to Foster.

The Food Hub acts as a delivery point for producers on Tuesdays and a distribution and pick up point on Wednesdays. Grow Lightly also opens the Food Hub at Coal Creek Market days on the second Saturday of each month.

The Committee are also working on some safety issues to improve walkways and roads etc to ensure visitors moving around the cemetery avoid accidents. Tis will be ongoing around the grounds and also as we improve safety when funerals are held.

Special Thanks to our caretakers Andrew and Fay Siekman and also Debbie and Terry Williams our Grave Diggers for their assistance over the winter months with some very wet surrounds to work with. We managed to meet all the needs for funerals including a double vault installation.

Projects we are looking at include possible cementing the internal paths within the Monumental Garden, adding another twelve plots in the Lawn Section for Headstones and a single vault. Long-term resident Shirley Cowling donated the cake.


