

DID YOU KNOW?

Spring is the best time to get high school seniors registered to vote, particularly the 40% of them who will not go on to college in the fall! Almost every single American graduating from high school this Spring (4 million in total!) is old enough to register to vote, regardless of what state they live in.

This means graduation season IS voter registration season! And as one of our supporters, we're asking you to help spread the word...

Now that you know who to connect with, think about the best way to get the message out. Whether social media post, DM, email, text, or calling – you know your people best and where they will be most receptive.

We drafted something you can work from as a post on any social platform, so try a tweet, thread, text, or email. It can even be made into a call script!

Be sure to customize and make this feel authentic to you and your audience.

Only about 30% of 18-year-olds are registered to vote, and we know connecting with them while they're still in high school is our best chance.
