- To act as project architect leading on the delivery of a range of RAFT projects including early stage zero carbon and retrofit feasibility studies, heat decarbonisation plans, RIBA design stages 1-7 for retrofit design projects.
- To act project architect leading on the delivery of heat decarbonisation plans (funded by the LCSF) for 3 or 4 schools in London and 1 school in Leeds
- To work with other project architects and assistants in the team.
- To develop and implement Project Architect Protocols in consultation with project architects and assistants within teams.
- To act as project architect (leading or assisting) on other retrofit projects in the
 office developing design packages, contract administration and liaising with
 clients as required by project demands.
- To manage architectural assistants/technologists/retrofit coordinators on projects.
- To attend meetings and visit project/construction sites in person when needed.
- To carry out low carbon and Passivhaus retrofit design, thermal modelling (designPH and PHPP) and construction quality inspections.
- To assist in the day to day running of projects, including occasional support on other projects and administrative/marketing tasks within RAFT.
