IM LAUDER ('Jim the Janny' to most of you) has been welcoming supporters and visitors to The Greenyards for over 40 years.

Jim is an Honorary Life member at the club now.

BRENDAN MOLLOY caught up with him recently to talk about his life in rugby.

'I'm a Lauder boy, a Borderer through and through. I started playing rugby in the early 60s when I was posted to the Army Catering Corps at Aldershot.' Interestingly, Jim told me that his first position was prop, but when he got fitter he moved out to the wing! I started to picture Pierre Schoeman or Tadhg Furlong pulling on a number 14 jersey, but I digress.

'I spent a few years playing for Gala Star, and there was a period in the early 70s when I was playing for Leicester Seconds ('The Jimmys' as they were called) when they wanted me to move up to the 1XV and play alongside Dusty Hare and Chalky White.'

And after his rugby playing career? 'I joined the Borders Referees Society and moved on into refereeing. I enjoyed that immensely, and even now I do a bit of coaching for young refs coming through'.

'In 1980, I got a job as janitor at Melrose Primary School, and on the very first day, Stuart Henderson asked me to come to the club and help out. I've been manning the gate on match days ever since.' I asked Jim to share some of his highlights from the past 44 years. 'Obviously, the first memory that springs to mind was the visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth to Melrose, taking in Melrose Sevens. I was asked to be part of the team to look after The Queen and the Duke of Buccleuch, and to raise the Royal Ensign

above the Press Box. I was also privileged to act as doorman at Murrayfield for Her Highness Princess Anne for five years.'

Any other stand out memories Jim? 'In 2001, Melrose Rugby toured South Africa, and played 1999 finalists Villagers, as well as Knysna. It was a great trip, but at one point I dropped my hat at a safari park, and it was savaged by a lion. The locals retrieved the hat, framed it and presented it to me.'

Does Jim have a favourite player?
'Oh yes, he's a family friend, and
I've known him since he was a wee
lad, but I'd have to say Chick Chalmers.
I've been to his wedding, and I've been

to his Dad's funeral, but he is undoubtedly the best player I've watched play at The Greenyards. Robbie Brown is another great player, and a local lad too.'

And finally Jim, why have you managed the gate for so long? And how long will you continue?
'I love doing it. I recognise folk coming through the turnstile, whether it's a home 15-a-side match, or if I'm an Ambassador at the Sevens. I've had my photo taken with Doddie, and I've been presented with a trophy from the Borders Referees Society.'
'I'll keep doing it til I cannae do it any more.'

THE Inauguration Dinner at the 2022 Sevens was attended by over 300 Rugby Sevens enthusiasts, and saw some of the all-time greats of Rugby Sevens being inducted into the Hall of Fame. This year, Melrose Rugby welcomes two more inductees to the Jackson Distillers Hall of Fame. Held in the 1883 VIP Pavilion, it will be an evening not to be missed.

Carl Hogg, a revered figure in the Borders rugby community, enjoyed a distinguished career as a player and has continued to make significant contributions to the sport in various coaching roles. His exceptional skills and dedication to the game have left an indelible mark on the rugby landscape. One of his biggest impacts on the rugby world will always be his contribution to Melrose Rugby. Hogg helped Melrose win the Melrose Sevens not only in 1997, but also for a second time in 1998 alongside the likes of fellow Melrose legends Craig Chalmers, Bryan Redpath and Andy Purves.

Arthur 'Hovis' Brown, a former Scottish internationalist, has contributed greatly to rugby in Scotland. He started playing rugby at Gala RFC and was a talented player in both the fifteen and seven-a-side game. Among his many sevens triumphs, the 1969 Gala Sevens final at Netherdale stands out. Brown helped the home team to a resounding victory against Loughborough College with a commanding score of 38-5. Brown's career also includes playing a pivotal part of the winning Gala team at the 1970,1971 & 1972 Melrose Sevens.

SUPER SERIES RUGBY

T THE start of February, the Southern Knights commenced their pre-season training in preparation for the 2024 Super Series Sprint Season.

Core contracted players were joined by players from Hawick, Gala, Kelso, Jed-Forest, Peebles, Selkirk, Melrose, Edinburgh Accies & Musselburgh. These players, with the support of their club are taking up opportunities to be part of a wider training group. This wider training group is in place to allow players to experience the environment but also to give them an insight into what the programme will entail and whether it's something they want to do or not. The buy in and support that local clubs **EXCITED ABOUT** and in particular the Head Coaches of these clubs has given us a great opportunity to invite players who we and their respective club coaches feel **STYLE AND** can take the next step and thrive in Super Series Rugby.

The earlier sessions have been relatively low key, starting with a meeting with an overview of who's who and what to expect then working through attack and defence themes

that we'll be pushing throughout the Sprint Series. We want to create a clear playing identity that is effective but also great to watch. There are a lot of moving parts that make that happen but we're in a good place following a period of recruitment and retention.

Adapting our weekly training structure to work with clubs and districts has been a key change for us. We want to work directly with the SRU Academy and provide aspirational youngster with an opportunity to experience a Super Series environment. We're grateful to Bert Grigg for his support in making this happen. We understand that players still have aspirations to represent their club in the Cup, Border League and Melrose Sevens, and there are others who will be pushing to pull on the red and white hoops of the South. We don't want to get in the way of that. If it's important to them, it's important to us. Come the middle of March, we have our exile group joining us. These are players who are Scots Qualified but currently playing down south or abroad in the Championship or the AIL in Ireland. We're really excited about the quality of these players and look forward to them joining the group.

> The process of recruitment & retention began in November last year with Scott Wight taking a lead on recruitment and leading on the Attack. I am leading on Defence alongside my Melrose Rugby Head Coach & Head of Youth Rugby roles. James Head has come on board to drive set-piece. Doug Crawford has started his role as General Manager, taking over from Kieran Cooney, so we're excited to what impact Doug can have in the role.

We're delighted to renew our partnership with Unit 8 Tweedbank. Stephen Rayner has been excellent over the last while, providing us with not only an

outstanding facility but an energy and structured session to push the boys on.

We're really excited about the approach, the playing style and the group of players we've been able to bring together. Thank you to the clubs and coaches who have been so supportive in helping this happen.

N 1ST March, a magnificent fund-raising event will commence at Murrayfield when teams of intrepid cyclists undertake an ultra-marathon cycle from Edinburgh to Rome. The aim of the event is to raise funds for Myname5Doddie to fund research into a cure for MND. Their total target is £850,000.

Our own Ben Weir is taking part. I interrupted Ben from his training schedule for the punishing event. "My girlfriend Olivia and I are part of a team. We call ourselves 'Team International Roaming Bundle' - the others are Olivia's dad Keith, his mates Kristian, and Matt, whose granddad died of MND. And we have a fantastic support crew (Malcolm and Richard) who keep us all well fed and watered. There are 22 teams in total across Britain and Ireland, and we all aim to arrive at Stadio Olympico in Rome on March 8th in time for the Italy Scotland 6 Nations match."

I asked Ben about his goals for the event. "Well, obviously there's money to be raised. Liv and I have a target of £5,555. And our team goal is £30,000. But it's also about raising awareness."

And how is the training going? "We're doing a lot of cycling to be honest. Liv is managing about 40 miles per day. Along with my engineering studies, I'm managing to get around a route from Stow to Lauder

to Melrose and back home, about 45 miles."

What's your greatest fear? "My bum! 1,700 miles is daunting. But it's not that bad when you remember what you're doing it for. I'm looking forward to meeting everybody in Rome and saying 'thanks'"
