### WHERE DO I START?

- Before applying for a grant, you'll need to apply for a Unique Entity Identifier on SAM.gov
  - o Check out the video on the right-hand side of this page for guidance
  - You should plan on beginning this application process 6 8 weeks before a grant application is due - it can take a while!
- Then, register an account on Grants.gov using the same email you used on SAM.gov

- Then you can register on EPA.gov, Energy.gov, or any other federal sites that you'd like to apply for a grant on.

## I DON'T HAVE A SAM.GOV ENTITY ID, CAN I STILL APPLY FOR GRANTS?

To apply for federal grants, you will need a Unique Entity ID (from registering on SAM.gov). However, other funding opportunities do not require you to have a UEI.
