OUR LOCATION ©

Located just 3 miles west of the Oxford city limits off of Highway 6, Roundabout Oxford sits on nearly 90 acres of rolling hills and offers convenient access to the city's attractions, including dining, parks, shopping, and cultural sites.

The design of the resort will work to complement and preserve the natural landscape of its location. We want to prioritize the conservation of existing trees and vegetation and embrace the natural contours of the land. By building with, rather than altering, the area, we minimize our footprint and environmental impact.

WHAT'S IN A NAME

Roundabout Oxford RV & Water Resort is an ode to everything we love about the Lafayette-Oxford-University community. Guests will find that many of the attractions and spaces in the resort carry the names of the people and places — past and present — that have made the community so unique. Highlights include:

Yocona Bottom Beach

Roundabout Oxford's sandy beach is named after the Yocona River and the Yocona River Inn, a beloved steakhouse in Abbeville that burned down after 14 years of service.

Swayze River

Oxford will have the Swayze
River— a tribute to Ole Miss
sports, specifically, the home
field of Rebel Baseball.

Molly Barr Bar

Molly Barr was a prominent
African American business woman in
Oxford whose name adorns a road in the
area. Molly Barr Bar will also be the name
for the main pool deck concession stand at
Roundabout Oxford.

The Hoka Hut

The Hoka Hut will be a vibrant

swim-up gathering spot that will serve beverages to people in the Swayze River and the adult pool and spa. It is named in honor of longtime Oxford resident Ron Shapiro's beloved local theater, which closed its doors nearly 30 years ago.

SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES

In alignment with our commitment to sustainable development, we are dedicated to incorporating eco-friendly practices throughout its operations, including:

- Prioritizing the use of recycled plastic materials, deploying them extensively across the property, including several hundred recycled plastic chairs, tables, and other poolside amenities.
- Implementation of low voltage and LED lighting solutions throughout the premises to minimize our energy footprint.
- An on-site glass bottle recycler, a system designed to convert discarded glass into sand. This sand will
 find new life in various applications throughout the resort, including on our sandy beach and our sand
 volleyball court.
- Energy-efficient appliances within our food and beverage services, laundry operations, and throughout the park's infrastructure, wherever possible.



WHAT KINDS OF VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE RESORT?

Roundabout Oxford will welcome a variety of recreational vehicles, including motorhomes, fifth wheels and travel trailers. Whether you're steering a cozy travel trailer or a luxurious motorhome, you'll find a spot with us.

Due to Lafayette County regulations, we will not be able to accommodate tent camping or horse/cattle trailers with sleeping compartments within the RV resort. Guests will also be limited to a maximum stay of 14 consecutive days.

HOW MUCH WILL RV SPACES COST PER NIGHT?

RV resorts are typically more affordable than hotels or other accommodations, and that will be the case for Roundabout.

Like similar RV and water resorts in the South, pricing will vary depending on demand. Rates will be higher during popular seasons, and when demand is lower, guests will enjoy more budget-friendly rates.

WILL THERE BE DAY PASSES FOR THE RESORT SO LOCAL RESIDENTS CAN ENJOY THE AMENITIES?

Like a hotel swimming pool, Roundabout Oxford's amenities will first be for guests who have reserved an RV site or a cottage. However, the RV sites and cottages will not always be full. During those times, we will welcome local day passes to enjoy the amenities when there are empty sites and cottages.
