3. Securing and aligning collective effort to deliver the outcomes and have impact.

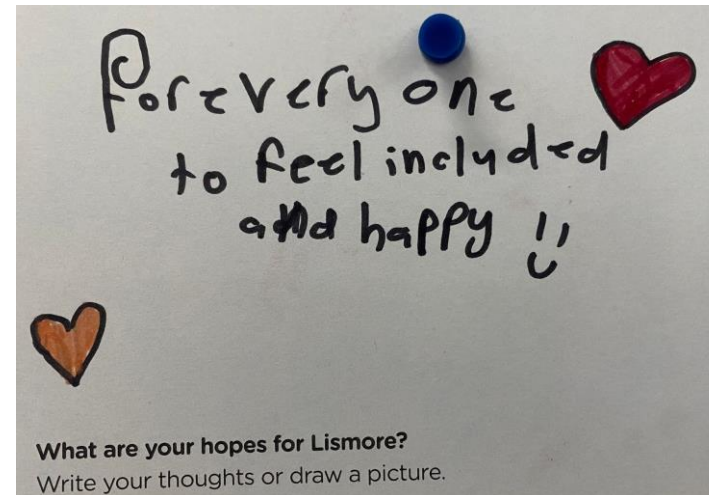
What this delivers

7. Funding Strategy

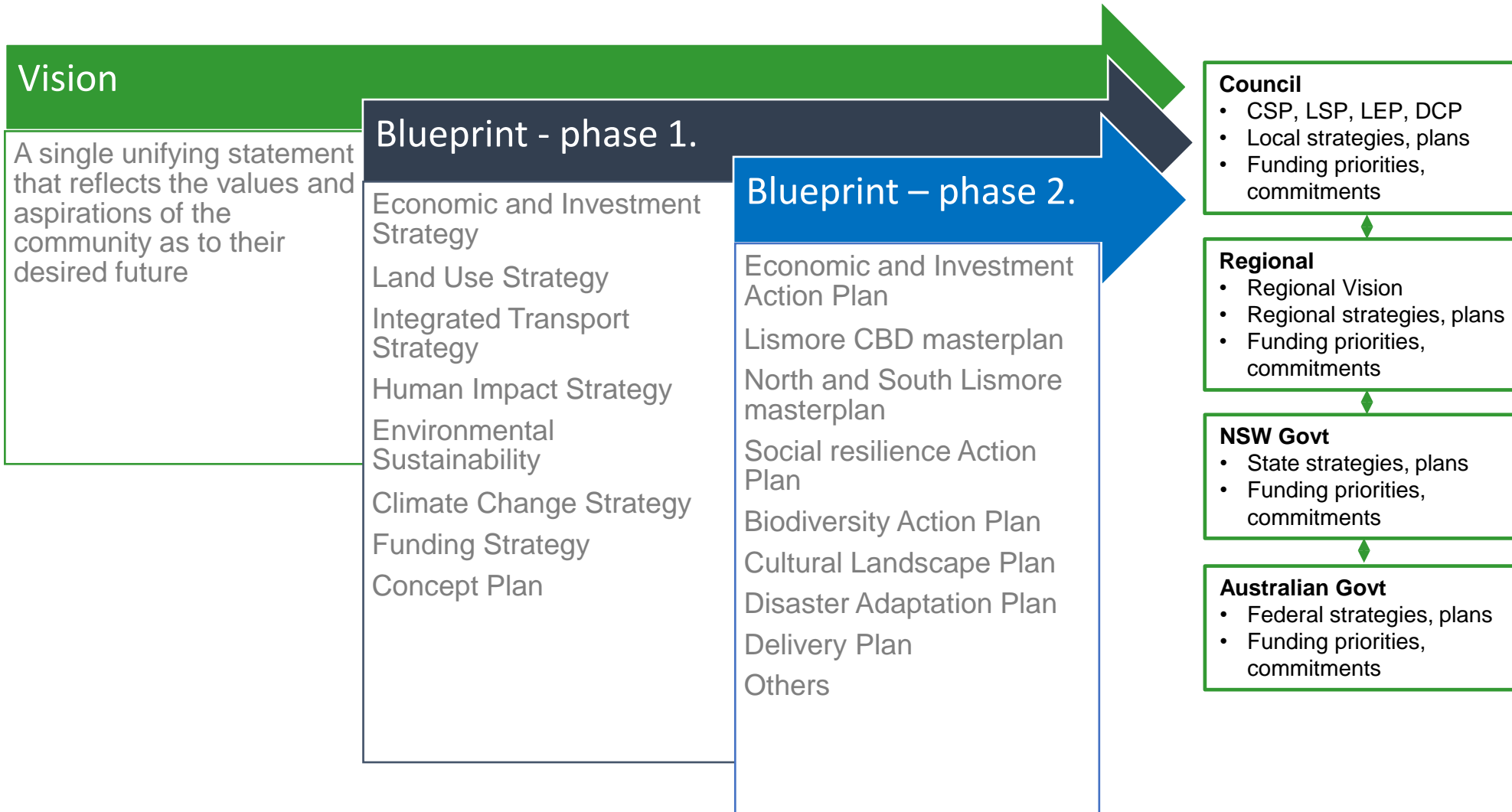

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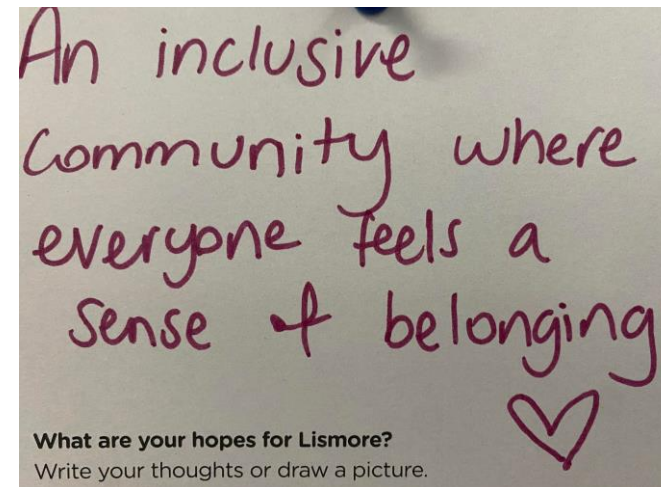
