Lapsang Souchong Tea, Shochu, Ginger, Green Pepper, Lemon

Emperor Qian Long was amazed by how tea can be poured from the pot without spilling a drop. He wanted to try this out so he would inconspicuously dress in common clothes to pour tea for his servants while visiting Tea houses in town. As a secret sign of respect, they would tap the table slightly using three fingers to symbolize bowing to the Emperor.

Eastern Beauty 東方美人 45

Long Jing Green tea, Shochu, Pineau Park, Blackberry, Mint

fruity, with soft tannins and light berry notes.

It was once said that there were four great beauties in Chinese history: Xi Shi, Wang Zhaojun, Diaochan and Yang Guifei. These beauties were so impactful that they were able to change history with their actions and influence with Kings and Emperors. This cocktail teapot is based on an imaginary meeting of these women gathering one night to share stories of their experiences.

Fortune Piece 發財板

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Hong Mei Black Tea, Shochu, Cucumber, Rhubarb, Fino Sherry, Dill

refreshing and balanced with notes of cucumber with dill.

In classic Mahjong, there are 3 Dragon pieces: The White 白板 (bai ban), Red 紅中 (hóng zhōng) and Green 發 (fā) Dragons. The Green piece has the character 發 (fā); This character is a part of the saying, 發財 (fā cái). This saying translates to "get rich," but it also represents an archer releasing his or her draw and the Confucian virtue of sincerity.
