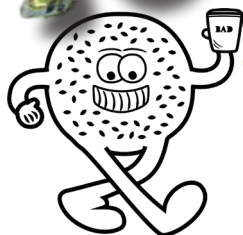

THE GAFFER'S TEAM TALK

A fortnight can be a long time in non-league football and what a fortnight we've just had! Was our 1-1 draw against Baldock Town a case of two points dropped or one point saved? It was a bit of both, really, although I thought we had enough of the possession and chances in the first half to deserve the lead – and two good penalty shouts turned down.

The last ten minutes of the game were absolutely crazy. We got the equaliser and were pushing for the winner when we should have had one of those penalties. Then there was the Micky Shuttlewood challenge, shall we call it, near the edge of our box when the ref gave a throw-in instead of a free-kick, so on balance a draw was probably a fair result.

Then came the news that St Panteleimon had folded with immediate effect, which came out of the blue. It's a real shame because I know their owner, George, well and I know how much blood, sweat, tears – and money – he has put into the club to get it to where it was. We've had some ding-dong battles with them over the past couple of years but it's been difficult for them not having a ground to call their own. It really does make us appreciate the set-up we have here at Rothamsted Park all the more.

I am sad for everyone connected with the club and I wish them the best but the fact is the situation has given us – and a few other teams – a fantastic opportunity. It was the honourable thing for George to call it early and let other clubs have that opportunity.

Of course, it gave us a lift before the Colney Heath game – not that we needed a boost before the local derby.

I love going there because we always get a great welcome and the games are competitive and Saturday was no exception.

We deserved to win the game but we needed some heroics from Eman Olajide in injury-time. It wasn't the best penalty but Eman has to take some credit for

that too because he gets into the taker's head and has given himself an advantage before the player has started his run-up. Eman had been fantastic for us this year – not just his play but his attitude to training, in the dressing room, and his influence on younger players.

And what can I say about Tuesday night's win at Milton Keynes Irish? I was so proud of every one of the players and my management and coaching team. Our attacking play was very good in the first half to give us the 2-0 lead and in the second half we defended with everything we had.

We knew there would be a big response from them and the game changed when Kyle Rahho got sent off. He was unfortunate because he got booked in the first half when he was given a bit of a dodgy pass and he took one for the team. The second one was a foul, no argument about that, but not every foul deserves a yellow card. They scored straight from the free-kick too so it took real character to reset and not concede again.

I felt we had learned from the Real Bedford game where we led and went down to 10 men but couldn't hold on. We didn't have much of the ball but we closed down the space and defended as a team very well.

Everyone was buzzing afterwards. I got home at about half-past midnight, my wife made me a cup of tea, and it took me about another hour to wind down.

On nights like that she understands why I love being involved in football because it more than makes up for the days when we're sitting there reflecting on a bad result.

The reality of the run-in is that next morning our thoughts had already turned to today's game and a massive week for the club. The players can see the end of the season and they realise there's a chance to be part of history but that it will require the same intensity and commitment we saw on Tuesday in every game – starting today.

In 1897 members of Sawbridgeworth Cricket Club decided to start a football club to play during the winter months.

The first match was a friendly against a public school XI, (probably Felstead) and a schoolboy spectator at the game recorded that the Sawbridgeworth XI wore purple jerseys and the ref, (probably a schoolmaster) wore a black and white blazer.

Sawbridgeworth lost that first game 1-0. The first organised league competition they joined was the Stortford and Stansted League. There are surviving fixture cards dating back to 1900, stating the club played at Great Hyde Hall, just on the Herts side of the Herts-Essex border. The club's headquarters was a room in the White Lion pub in the town centre.

In the 1920s they played in the East Herts League, winning the title in 1924. During this period they played Burnham Ramblers, (who would become fellow members of the Essex Senior League 50 years later) in a cup final at Coopers Field, a popular ground roughly where the Hand and Crown pub is now.

Gate takings were £50 and, as the entry fee was sixpence, that suggests that 2,000 people were at the match! Ramblers won the game 2-1.

In 1930 Sawbridgeworth Town FC moved to the present ground. It was surrounded by farmland and access was from Cambridge Road (which is still used by pedestrians), so it became known as The Cambridge Road Ground.

After an unsuccessful season in the

Spartan League, Sawbridgeworth Town joined the Herts County League Division One in 1953 but another unsuccessful season saw them move into the Bishops Stortford, Stansted and District League in 1955.

In the late 1960s and early 1970s the housing estate was built on fields next to the ground and a new entrance was made at the end of Crofters, hence the ground became known as Crofters End.

The club was a founder member of the Essex Olympian League in 1966 and won the league championship in 1972, also winning the Herts Intermediate Cup, by beating Cockfosters 1-0 at Ware's old ground. In 1975 the club applied to gain senior status and were advised to apply for entry into the Herts Senior Cup.

Despite losing 2-1 away to Boreham Wood, they acquitted themselves well enough to attain senior status.

Sawbridgeworth Town joined the Essex Senior League in 1976 and spent 47 seasons there. In 1993 they were runners-up and in 1995 they again finished second, this time on goal average.

Sawbridgeworth Town hold the record for the number of League Cup final appearances (seven times) but have only won the cup once when, beating Stansted 2-0. The club has also won the Herts Charity Shield three times.

For the current season, Sawbridgeworth Town were moved across from the Essex Senior into the Spartan South Midlands Football League Premier Division.

BALDOCK TOWN H 1-1

The second biggest home crowd of the season packed Rothamsted Park on Non-League Day and saw Harpenden dominate the opening 45 minutes without making the breakthrough their play deserved. Ryan Plowright hit the woodwork, James Ewington had a shot saved and Jake Anthony was tripped in the box only for the referee to book him for simulation.

Encouraged by keeping a clean sheet, Baldock started the second half strongly and Harps needed keeper Connor Coulson to be at his best on two occasions to keep it level.

Then, midway through the second half, Baldock opened the scoring with a header from a corner and suddenly Harpenden were doing all the chasing.

The visitors had several half-chances to extend their lead on the break before Harpenden threw caution to the wind late on.

An equaliser finally materialised seven minutes from time when Isaiah Hilaire headed the ball back across goal and Archie Locke nodded it home.

There was still time for a hectic finale – a penalty shout for a trip on Locke was waved away, then Baldock broke and Harps got a bit of luck when the ref gave a throw-in instead of a foul following a lunging last-ditch tackle from Mickey Shuttlewood.

COLNEY HEATH A 1-0

It was a cagey, but absorbing derby encounter with few clear-cut chances for either side until Dan Palmer broke the deadlock just before the half-hour mark. A deep, pinpoint Dave Keenleyside corner was headed home firmly by the central defender.

Colney Heath had a good spell of pressure at the start of the second half but the better chances fell to Harpenden as they hit the post and then the bar in quick succession. Isaiah Hilaire hit the post and James Ewington put the rebound over. Then Jake Anthony hit the bar and the ball bounced around in the box before a Harry Andic shot was deflected wide.

Harpenden were nearly made to rue those missed chances in injury time. It was into the fifth minute of added time when the referee pointed to the spot after Colney Heath striker George Sippetts tumbled in the box.

It looked a soft penalty and as the Harps players protested, Eman Olajide started preparing to face the kick. By the time Sippetts stepped up to take it, there were 99 minutes on the clock. His kick was weak, but Olajide still had to go the right way to stop it, sparking loud celebrations from the players in green and gold and the sizeable number of travelling fans. That was the last kick of the game as the referee blew for full-time immediately.

Pages through the ages

This collection of match programmes picked up on eBay offers a snapshot of how the club and the town have changed over the past half-century. The programme for the 1977-78 game against Stotfold states that Harps' home colours were white shirts and blue shorts.

By 1981-82, the club's colours had changed to the more familiar yellow shirts and blue shorts and the matchday programme – this one from an FA Vase tie against Grays Athletic – was the brilliantly-named Harpenden Town Crier.

The front covers over the past 45 years have featured cartoon illustrations, team photos and action shots and, in 2010-11, a picture of a silver Jaguar driving down Harpenden high street – which possibly says more about the town than the programme editor at the time realised!

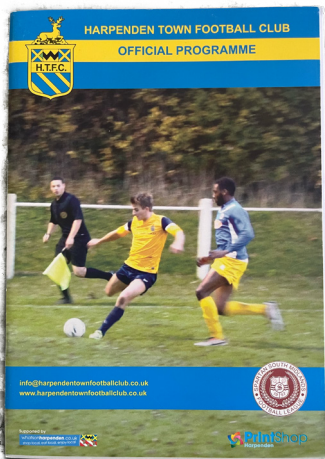
