Brandt Cappell announces run for Chelan County Commissioner

Brandt Cappell, a Wenatchee resident, is announcing his candidacy for Chelan County Commissioner, Position 3. He is running as a Republican. Cappell serves the community as a Senior Legislative Assistant to State Rep. Keith Goehner. This is his second run for county commissioner.

Cappell's extensive experience, having worked alongside two state representatives serving our area, equips him with the necessary skills to serve those he represents. "I know what it takes to be an effective servant to those I represent. Actions in Olympia directly affect our ability to govern in Chelan County. I've spent 13 years navigating the bureaucratic mess of state government. I will work to ensure Chelan County government isn't part of the problem."

Cappell's dedication to the future of North Central Washington motivates him to serve. "This is no part-time endeavor, and I am already in the community listening and learning. I want Chelan County to be where my children choose to live, work, and raise their families. I commit to being open and available to everyone and making informed decisions. Cappell looks to build on his previous bid for county commissioner. "It was challenging to run during COVID, but I am grateful to all who supported me. I know there are still issues around housing, property rights, and taxes. One thing that has changed is the prevalence of drugs, crime, and homelessness in Chelan County. It's no longer just a big city problem. We have all been affected by these tragic issues in some way. We can't have people dying on our streets while criminal activity runs rampant."

Brandt grew up in the Wenatchee Valley, living in Wenatchee and Chelan. He graduated from Wenatchee High School, attended Wenatchee Valley College, and holds a Bachelor of Science in Natural Resource Policy from Washington State University.

He is an elected member of the Leadership Team at Columbia Grove Covenant Church and serves on the Wenatchee Okanogan National Forest Recreational Advisory Committee. He was also recognized in the Wenatchee Valley Business World's "30 Under 35" Class of 2020.

Brandt and his wife, Brittney, have made their home in the North Wenatchee area. They have two daughters, Savannah (6) and Cassidy (2), and are expecting their third girl any day.
