


GoNaturePositive! pathways and partnerships towards a nature-positive economy



01/ BRIEFING NOTES



CONTEXT

The world's economic systems do not adequately recognise the value of nature to planetary and human health. The degradation of land and marine ecosystems undermines the well-being of billions of people, costing about 10% of the annual global gross product. However, the restoration of nature presents enormous economic opportunities. The idea of a nature-positive economy (NPE) – an economy that fully considers environmental impacts and sustainability, and works to actively improve the state of nature – and the pathways towards realising it remain poorly understood.

GoNaturePositive! is a Horizon Europe funded research and innovation action coordinated by Trinity College Dublin that brings together 20 partners across 14 countries and a global Impact Board, representing businesses, research institutions, NGOs and community organisations who are leading the nature-positive agenda at global and European levels. The overarching goal is to accelerate awareness and transformative action towards a nature-positive economy.

EXPECTED OUTPUT OF THIS EVENT

The first output of GoNaturePositive! will be the delivery of a clear EC definition and conceptual framework for the nature-positive economy (NPE). Research will take into account valuable existing knowledge from business and insights from other initiatives. Through collaboration, in this first meeting we aim to build pathways and partnerships towards an inclusive nature-positive economy.


