



WCC Rep-in-Development Program

WCC Rep Role and Entry Requirements

The role of the WCC Rep is to support and assist Competition Bodies in their championships by leading the Competition Body judge training with the WCC materials and overseeing the competitions. The WCC Rep encourages alignment with WCC standards, protocols, and practices.

The WCC Rep-in-Development program is the pathway for WCC Certified Judges becoming a WCC Rep. To enter the WCC Rep-in-Development program, applicants must first meet the minimum requirements detailed below. All documents and evidence must be sent to SCA for assessment and review.

WCC Rep-in-Development Program Minimum Requirements:

- Currently certified in WBC Sensory, WBrC Sensory, and 1 other WCC certification.
- Certified for at least 2 years in WBC, WBrC, and 1 other WCC.
- Judged at a CB event at least 3 times in the last 2 years*.
- Judged at a CB event in at least 2 locations in the last 2 years*.
- Judged at a WCC at least 2 times in the last 3 years.
- Letter of Recommendation from 1x WCC Rep

*CB events must have a WCC Rep present (e.g., not a qualifier or regional event) to count towards this requirement.

Rep-in-Development Program

During the WCC Rep-in-Development program, applicants are expected to attend Competition Body events as a shadow to the official WCC Rep that is attending. During the CB event, the applicant will assist the official WCC Rep that is attending with leading the judges and overseeing the competition. Applicants will eventually be required to lead competitions entirely, with the official WCC Rep supervising and assessing.

The official WCC Rep will observe the applicant's behaviour and performance and will be assessing using the WCC Rep Competencies tracker. The WCC Rep will provide SCA with detailed feedback and suggestions on improvements for the next event.

Once the feedback from the WCC Reps is aligned with the WCC Rep Competencies, and with little to no suggested improvements, the applicant will be confirmed as a WCC Rep. It is generally difficult to estimate the timeline, it depends on the applicant's ability to attend CB events. Applicants should be expected to attend at least 3 CB events during the program, but it could be many more before confirmation. SCA/WCC does not cover any expenses for the Rep-in-Development program and its applicants.
