

The Speedway Solar Project is intentionally designed to provide an opportunity for the next generation of Sherman County families to uphold the region's legacy of natural resource stewardship without sacrificing its proud agricultural heritage.

WHY THIS SITE?

Speedway Solar will integrate into the existing landscape, while respecting the established wildlife habitats and ensuring agricultural continuity.

- > The project is located next to an existing transmission line, minimizing the impact on surrounding properties.
- Solar panels will be installed in multiple array areas so that the project preserves wildlife corridors and avoids sensitive area.



- The project is not located within the state big game winter range habitat.
- The project's design ensures landowners can continue their agricultural operations to the extent practicable.

The project footprint is not meant to maximize energy output — it is meant to allow for the flexibility we know the community needs to continue to farm and recreate nearby.

- > 900 MW of energy potential
