

# What the Hell is Bobby Bonilla Day?

In the 2000 offseason, the New York Mets organization released Bobby Bonilla from the team despite having two years and \$5.9 million remaining on his contract. Instead of having this amount affect the payroll for the 2000 season, the Mets negotiated a deferred payment plan with Bobby. This payment plan would amount to a \$1.2 million payment, every July 1st from 2011 until 2035.

Deferred payments in baseball are fairly common and Bobby Bonilla's arrangement was far from the worst one negotiated. However, every July 1st, the baseball world used this as an opportunity to ridicule the Mets organization and thus Bobby Bonilla Day was born.


