## **Common interview questions:**

Why are you interested in this college? (AKA – Why are you a good fit for this college?)

What is your proudest accomplishment so far?

Can you tell me about your high school? (Pretend I've never heard of it before)

Why do you want to go to college?

Who is your favorite teacher? Who is your role model?

What would you change about your school, if you had the opportunity?

What are you most excited about for senior year?

Can you tell me about the curriculum at your school?

What majors or jobs have you been thinking about? How have you explored those interests already?

What do you do outside of academics?

What are three adjectives you'd use to describe yourself? What are three adjectives your friends/teachers would use to describe you?

Can you tell me about a book you've enjoyed recently?

What did you do over the summer?

Is there anything you would change about your academic career so far?

When you think about how college will be different from high school, what are you most excited about?

What are you either nervous or unsure about when you think ahead to college?

Can you tell me about a challenge you've overcome?

Have you learned anything about [specific college] that has surprised you?

What is one of your weaknesses? (Your strengths?)

Can you tell me about your family and your place in it?

Can you tell me about a time when you resolved a conflict?

Can you tell me about a time when you took on a leadership role? (formal or informal)

What are your career aspirations?

What do you hope to achieve in life?

What do you think it takes to be successful?

Can you tell me about a news story you've been following recently?

\*Can you tell me about the recruitment process so far? (athletes)

\*Can you tell me about the audition/portfolio you are preparing? (artists/performers)

## Job or Internship Questions:

Can you tell me about a time when you resolved a conflict?

Can you tell me about a time when you took on a leadership role?

Where do you see yourself in five years?

What are your career aspirations?

What role do you take when working on a team?

What do you hope to achieve in life?

What do you think will be the most challenging part of this job?

What do you think it takes to be successful?

## How to approach difficult questions:

If a question is too broad, you can frame the scope of your response, so there's an obvious stopping point. (*Ex: Tell me about yourself.*) "Here are three things I want you to know..."

If a question is too narrow and could be answered with one word, pretend you were also asked "Why" or "Why not" or give an example. (Ex: Are you enjoying your senior year?) "Yes! I'm most excited about..."

**If a question feels too personal, answer without answering, or politely decline.** (*Ex: Where else are you applying?*) "I'm considering schools in [region] that all have strong programs in [your intended major] and offer [club, team, or organization you hope to join]."
