Lewis R. Gordon is Board of Trustees Distinguished Professor of Philosophy and Global Affairs at the University of Connecticut, where he is also Head of the Department of Philosophy. His several hundred publications cover a wide-ranging variety of topics in Africana philosophy, existential philosophy, phenomenology, political theory, philosophy of science, psychoanalysis, philosophy of culture, aesthetics, Afro-Jewish studies, and more. He is author of fourteen books and editor or co-editor of six more. His books on Frantz Fanon include Fanon and the Crisis of European Man, Fanon: A Critical Reader, What Fanon Said, and "Not Bad for a N —, No?" His works on existentialism include Bad Faith and Antiblack Racism. Existence in Black. Existentia Africana, and Black Existentialism and Decolonizing Knowledge. Dr. Gordon was founding president of the Caribbean Philosophical Association, which he continues to serve as executive board member and chair of its awards committee. He is co-founding editor of Philosophy and Global Affairs and previously founding editor of Radical Philosophy Review. (bio by Thomas Meagher)
