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



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

Winning audience and jury awards, this remarkable debut film from director Tracie Laymon also scored the Grand Jury Prize at SXSW for a film based on a true story.

Taking a lighthearted premise, Laymon's film is grounded in humor and pathos making it a moving celebration of kindness.

In an attempt to reconnect with her estranged father, Lily sends a Facebook friend request to a man with the same name. While not her father, Bob (played with heartfelt warmth by John Leguizamo) becomes an unexpected and transformative presence in her life. As their bond deepens, Bob steps into the fatherly role Lily has longed for, while Lily brings new light and vitality into Bob's world. This poignant film reminds us that positive, supportive male energy has a crucial place in society and challenges the tendency to broadly vilify it.

The ensemble cast is exceptional and the connection between characters is authentic. Barbie Ferreira as Lily expresses vulnerability and growing confidence as she trusts and learns from her 'new dad'. It's an important message to connect with and it couldn't have been delivered by a better hand. - KK










Switzerland, Italy | 2024 | 105 min










**JULIE DELPY**

In 1960s Liverpool, Brian Epstein is a young man looking to expand his family's record business and manage artists himself. One night he goes into a decrepit cellar to discover a popular underground band he believes has potential. That band is The Beatles and Epstein becomes the secret ingredient that changes pop music forever.

Epstein's underappreciated legacy is explored in Joe Stephenson's Midas Man, a charming and touching biopic about the influential "fifth" Beatle. Stephenson provides a detailed portrait of not only Epstein's rise to be one of the world's most powerful music managers, but also the struggles Epstein faced - whether professional, keeping the band together, or personal, as a closeted queer man in the 1960s. The film is like any great Beatles track, it finds ways to explore deeper truths, while never losing the sense of joy that music brings.

Brought to life by an ensemble cast that includes Jacob Fortune-Lloyd (*Queen's Gambit*), Eddie Marsan and Academy-award nominee Emily Watson, Midas Man hits all the right notes in giving Epstein his deserved moment in the sun - JD



On a getaway to his holiday home with his new wife Sandy (Gabrielle Union) and his stepson, the peace is shattered by the arrival of his estranged son Rocco, Rocco's pregnant girlfriend and Vincent's drunk and horny first wife Ruth (Jennifer Coolidge) who are on the run from two gangsters Lefty (Bill Murray) and Lonnie (Pete Davidson).

The character work is exceptional. Coolidge's Ruth is jaw droppingly unfiltered and her ability to be cringe inducing is impressive. Bill Murray as Lefty is equally impressive playing a philosophical cold-blooded killer with a healthy dose of comedic charm.

Within this great cast Ed Harris stands out, equally believable as a man with a violent history and a truly reformed family man trying to stay on the right path.

Riff Raff examines our relationship with ourselves, our past and our bonds of friendship, obligation and family in a darkly comedic way. - RW

Based on a true story, Steve Coogan plays Tom Michell, an English professor who arrives in Buenos Aires to teach at a private school on the eve of the coup d'etat that plunged Argentina into turmoil in 1976. Tom is cynical, sarcastic and disillusioned and the circumstances of his employment and the situation around him do nothing to improve his attitude. Jonathan Pryce, as the admonishing headmaster advising all to keep out of the chaos, is on point.

During a brief escape to Uruguay, Tom rescues a penguin from an oil slick to impress a woman he has just met. Tom tries to convince the penguin to return to the ocean, but the penguin has other ideas and insists on staying close to his rescuer. And so begins the relationship between Tom and the charmingly named Juan Salvador.

Juan Salvador casts a spell on everyone who meets him, and he quickly becomes Tom's best friend and confidante.

Director Cattaneo (*Full Monty*) weaving comedy and drama together, tempers the dark backdrop of a turbulent time with the beguiling little penguin and a sense of reawakening personal and political responsibility. – RW

# **FAIRY CREEK**

### JEN MURANETZ

Canada (BC) | 2024 | 85 min

The blockades protesting the logging of the Fairy Creek watershed on Vancouver Island — one of the last remaining stands of old-growth timber in B.C. — marked the largest act of civil disobedience in Canadian history. Over a two-year period, director Muranetz offers an intimate look behind the scenes of the protest, capturing the relentless struggle of the activists who battled not only the logging company but also the RCMP, who were tasked with enforcing court orders granting the loggers access to the land.

Muranetz skillfully documents the inventive and resourceful tactics used by the protesters, the strong sense of community that formed within the blockade, and the intricate coordination that sustained their efforts. The film also doesn't shy away from the violence that erupted as police used force and tear gas to break through protest lines, underscoring the physical and emotional toll on both the protesters and the authorities.

At its core, Fairy Creek is a study of relationships. Muranetz captures the complex dynamics between protesters and the RCMP, whose interactions, shaped by two years of constant engagement, range from hostile to unexpectedly familiar. The film also explores the tensions within the Indigenous community itself, with some members supporting the protests and others opposing them, as well as the friction between Indigenous and settler factions within the movement.

While the Pacheedaht First Nation and Teal Jones Group declined to participate in the film, potentially leaving it open to accusations of bias, Muranetz wisely focuses on the people within the protest and the diversity of perspectives that shaped their collective action. This approach adds depth and nuance, making the film a poignant reflection of human values, conflict, and solidarity in the face of environmental and social struggle. - RW

# **DUST TO DUST**

**KOSAI SEKINE** 

Japan | 2024 | 89 min

Where do old clothes go to die? For Yuima Nakazato, one of Japan's leading haute couture designers, the question is at the heart of the future of fashion and the health of the planet. In this eye-opening documentary, director Kosai Sekine follows the quiet-spoken designer in his late thirties, in his ponytail and halting English, as he gets on a plane, not to Milan or Paris, but Nairobi. Kenya is one of the African countries where much of the world's used clothing is dumped, most of it ending in landfills or open-air burn pits.

According to the UN, the clothing industry is second only to the oil industry in its ecological impact. We follow Nakazato as he wanders through the massive Gikomba Market where used clothes are sold by the hundreds of kilos, and northern Kenya, where former grazing pastures have turned to deserts. With eight weeks to go before presenting at the Paris Haute Couture show, the designer begins avidly looking for solutions, drawing on cutting edge new technology, including synthetic proteins inspired by spider webs, to solve the problems old technology has created.

As the clock ticks down toward the Paris show, Nakazato works to the point of exhaustion. We watch as he draws inspiration from both traditional Japanese and Kenyan clothing, creating outfits using squares of cloth suspended on strings. These designs evoke the intricate folds of origami, while the colors shimmer in a way reminiscent of a Monet painting. It's a gorgeous reimagining of high fashion as an inspiration for environmental sanity. -LL

# **HOMEGROWN**

In the current polarized American political environment, both left and right seem to agree on one thing: the status quo is broken. Michael Premo, a Black American activist and filmmaker deeply involved in the Occupy Wall Street movement, decided to learn about people who didn't agree with him. To do so, he embedded himself with three far-right extremists of the Proud Boys. Using a mostly unobtrusive camera with a few direct-to-camera interviews, Premo lets us get to know these men, in many ways as they might want to be seen but without rationalizing their anger, bigotry, and misinformed views.

The three men include Randy, a military veteran, Chris, a New Jersey man married to a Chinese-born nurse, and Thad, a conservative Texan Latino who also supports Black Lives Matter. Rejecting the "white supremacist" label, they see themselves as "Western chauvinists", dedicated to saving capitalism and traditional family values from Antifa and liberals. At the same time, Premo's film shows how they put their family's welfare in jeopardy by flaunting COVID restrictions, spending household income on expensive military gear and travel, and risking long prison sentences. The culmination of their crusade is the assault on the Washington D.C. Capitol building on Jan. 6, 2021, shown with previously unseen footage from the middle of the angry throng. -LL



Drawing from his own experience serving in the US Army, writer/director Kyle Hausmann-Stokes crafts a strikingly poignant narrative about the mental toll paid by veterans, even once they've returned home. - ML





Fernando Andrés' wry topical comedy, Rent Free updates that social milieu for a new generation who are negotiating the challenges of queer friendships, app-driven social interactions and the daunting cost of housing for the irregularly employed.

Brash, impulsive Ben (Jacob Roberts) and passive Jordan (David Treviño) have been friends since childhood. When Ben gets kicked out of his New York apartment for an inappropriate indiscretion, they return together to Austin. After wearing out their welcome at Jordan's girlfriend's place, they hatch a not-so-brilliant plan: They will save money by couch-surfing with friends for a full year and then Ben will return to New York. Soon Ben and Jordan learn that freeloading is hard work, as they burn through a succession of temporary hosts. Each time Ben and Jordan move to each new abode, the film shows a title card lists its amenities and monthly cost of the place, a recurrent reminder that it is impossible to pursue your dreams when you don't know where you are going to lay your head at night. - LL

## **SOULEYMANE'S STORY**

**BORIS LOJKINE**

Souleymane works a precarious job as a bike courier in Paris while preparing for his asylum hearing. With only two days left to memorize the story he thinks will help grant him the ability to stay and work in France, he comes up against one obstacle after another, endangering his ability to attend the interview. All throughout, Souleymane maintains an increasingly fragile connection with his mother and girlfriend back home in Guinea, through nothing but the tiny screen of his cellphone, and it becomes more and more difficult to remember why he made this journey in the first place.

Set in a tight timeframe, Souleymane's Story recalls films from the Dardenne Brothers, as we become desperate for him to make his hearing. First-time actor Abou Sangare draws from his own personal story to give an arresting performance, for which he won the Un Certain Regard Best Actor prize at Cannes.

It's an empathetic window into one immigrant's journey, but it also gives us structural insight. Before dawn each day, the homeless shelter lights up with everyone's alarms going off in unison, so that they be the first to reserve a bed elsewhere for the next night. It's just one example of the mechanics that the many unhoused and undocumented men and women of our cities must contend with - the people of whom we demand so much yet try so hard to render invisible. -AK

The title character, Aberdeen, portrayed in a dynamic performance by Gail Maurice (*Bones of Crows*), faces displacement from her home community of Peguis and becomes unhoused in Winnipeg. She struggles with alcohol addiction and estrangement from her daughter and grandchildren. Her journey is marked by continuous confrontations and loss after loss.

In a failed attempt to run from the law, Aberdeen loses her Status Card and ID. While she is locked up, she calls on her trusty brother, Boyd (played by Ryan Black, *Dance Me Outside*), to help get her out. Boyd has recently placed Aberdeen's three grandchildren into the foster care system due to his cancer diagnosis, and he urges her to get healthy and return home to care for them.

Aberdeen isn't ready for that responsibility, but after hitching a ride back to Peguis to get a new Status Card, she comes face-to-face with her past family traumas and reconnects with her community. As she tries to piece her life back together, she faces more systemic strife and immense personal loss. However, her spirit and love for her family grows stronger.

Aberdeen marks the directorial debut of both Ryan Cooper and Eva Thomas, who deftly tell a raw story marked by grief, anger, and heartbreak, while also weaving in moments of laughter, relief, and family tenderness. - BC

## FORBIDDEN MUSIC

BARBARA HAGER

Forbidden Music is a powerful documentary exploring the extraordinary partnership between Kwakwaka'wakw Chief Mungo Martin and Jewish ethnomusicologist Dr. Ida Halpern. Nearly 75 years ago, they preserved hundreds of Indigenous songs at risk of being lost to cultural genocide. Both had endured devastating cultural suppression: Dr. Halpern fled Nazi-occupied Austria, where her parents were killed, while Chief Martin faced Canada's Potlatch Ban and the enduring trauma of residential schools.

Defying laws prohibiting First Nations cultural practices, Dr. Halpern immigrated to Canada to document Indigenous music. She gained the trust of singers from the Kwakwaka'wakw, Haida, Nuu-chah-nulth, and Coast Salish communities, and in 1951, she joined forces with Chief Martin to record 124 traditional songs, preserving his rich musical heritage.

Directed by Barbara Todd Hager, this world premiere follows the journey of these recordings from their origins to archival collections and back to Fort Rupert. It highlights how Chief Martin's legacy continues to inspire the revitalization of Kwak'wala songs and language today. – MH

## **NANEKAWÂSIS**

What drives an artist to create work for 40+ years with no signs of slowing down? In Nanekawâsis, director Conor McNally (*The Gift of Being Different*) skillfully weaves archival footage from renowned nêhiyaw artist George Littlechild's career alongside recent interviews with the artist and his partner, John Powell. We witness the beginning of his creative process and explore what is propelling him forward into the future.

With a deep connection to his culture, the land, and the spiritual world, Littlechild uses color as a healing tool to spread "joy to the planet," while also choosing not to ignore the problems embedded within both history and the present day. At 65 years old, Littlechild has lived through many of the traumatic experiences common to 60s Scoop survivors. He also acknowledges the encouragement he received from his foster family to pursue his artistic vision at a young age. Much of his earlier work was groundbreaking in its exploration of subject matter drawn from his personal experience as a displaced Indigenous person, as well as the challenges facing his family and community.

As the film notes, "to live is to tell a story" in the nêhiyaw way of being. From his humble beginnings in Edmonton to the glitzy art shows of the '80s and '90s, George Littlechild broke through doors for Indigenous artists and continues to hold them open, while maintaining a contemplative, contemporary, and colorful artistic path. – BC

## SO SURREAL: BEHIND THE MASKS

### NEIL DIAMOND & JOANNE ROBERTSON

In the art market, ceremonial Indigenous masks have always been seen as relics and commodities—bought, sold, and collected by any means in order to profit from them further. To the Yup'ik, Kwakwaka'wakw, and other Indigenous peoples, these masks act as vessels to the spirit world and translators of the supernatural, existing beyond our reality.

In So Surreal: Behind the Masks, we follow co-director Neil Diamond (Reel Injun) as he uncovers the mystery and history behind the collecting of these so-called art pieces.

At the outset of the film, while in New York, Diamond reads about a 100+-year-old Yup'ik mask up for sale at the TEFAF Art Fair. Struck by the image of the mask and its place in the contemporary market, he sets out to find it. Once at the exhibition, he learns that the mask was once owned by Surrealist artist Enrico Donati. This serves as the catalyst for him to learn more about the relationship these masks have with the art world, their collectors (including the Surrealists), and how they were acquired—often under the guise of the Potlatch ban and the myth of the "vanishing Indian."

Through his inquiries and research, Diamond discovers that many of these masks ended up in France after World War II, as many of the Surrealists took them back there after living in exile in the United States. What follows are tense conversations around repatriation and where these masks truly belong. Questions about value, ownership, and the purpose of these sacred objects persist. While some have had their spirits sung back into their home, others remain locked away in collections, known and unknown. - BC

In Sweet Summer Pow Wow, Darrell Dennis offers a deeply personal exploration of love, identity, and tradition.

Jinny lives on the Shuswap Reserve. Her diabetic mother Cara is the Chief and expects her daughter to get a law degree, return home, and follow in her footsteps. Jinny agrees to spend her last summer on the Pow Wow circuit with her mother. But Jinny loves contemporary dancing, not Native fancy dancing. On another nearby Reserve, lives Riley. His single dad is a drunk. Luckily for Riley, his Uncle Luke invites him to join his drum group on the Pow Wow circuit before Riley goes to live with him in Vancouver. This world premiere at the Victoria Film Festival follows this young Indigenous couple as they get a break from their troubled lives when they find each other through a summer of love on the Pow-Wow circuit.

Director Dennis (The Great Salish Heist, 2024), known for his insightful storytelling that highlights Indigenous identity and culture, brings a unique blend of tenderness and tension to this narrative. His direction navigates the delicate balance between personal desires and the collective responsibilities of family and community. The film beautifully captures the intersection of tradition and modernity, illustrating how both can shape and challenge our most intimate relationships. -MH

## THE STAND

### **CHRIS AUCHTER**

In his documentary feature film debut, Haida director/animator Christopher Auchter (*Now is the Time*) shines a light on the 1985 conflict between the Haida Nation and colonial governments, as well as their logging interests on Lyell Island in Haida Gwaii. The logging practices at the time destroyed salmon runs and took large swaths of oldgrowth forests without any consent or consultation with the Haida Nation. The Haida have been stewards of the land since time immemorial. What follows is a series of tense standoffs, negotiations, disagreements, and subsequent arrests of the Haida by the RCMP, acting as representatives of the government and the logging company.

Auchter makes a conscious choice to use footage exclusively from the time period. This decision immerses the viewer in the reality of the struggle, free from the distraction or foretelling that can accompany retrospection. He uses archival footage gifted by Susan Underwood, who was embedded with the Haida Blockade at the time, alongside archival news sources, including fiery exchanges between bombastic newscaster Jack Webster and the poised responses of Indigenous leaders Myles Richardson (Haida) and James Gosnell (Nisga'a). The juxtaposition and interweaving of these audiovisual sources drive the film, underscoring its urgency and the stark dichotomy between the sides involved.

The health of the land and waters coincides with the health of humanity as a whole, and this film captures an encounter that resonates in the present and well into the future, as the Haida Nation and all Indigenous nations fight to maintain the well-being of our lands and waters. – BC

You have never seen a punk rock opera quite like this. (S)KiDS centres on a group of rebellious teens in 1993 as they navigate their last year of high school questioning the authority of the adults in their lives.

Scotty, a teenage punk poet, reluctantly moves to the City of Champions in the Canadian midwest with his parents. His defiant attitude and general dismissal of everyone gets him into trouble on both sides of the law. The oppressive school principal tries to shake Scotty's spirituous antics while the school's drug dealer, Sammy, eyes Scotty as his latest target to bully. Amid the early troubles, Scotty finds sanctuary in Billy and Craig, two outcasts known as "skids". The three become entwined through their love of music, shared experiences of neglect and abuse, and surging desire to expose the hypocrisy of the authority figures in their lives.

Featuring all new songs by Vancouver-based band Rare Americans, (S)KiDS is an original and emotional film that captures the fleeting energy of teens trying to find their place in the world without conceding to the demands of those in power.

Winner of the Un Certain Regard prize at the 2024 Cannes Film Festival, Guan Hu's *Black Dog* might just be the best film about a man and his dog since Vittorio de Sica's 1952 film *Umberto D*. This stunning, poetic film follows Lang (Eddie Peng), who was once a local celebrity, as he returns to his hometown after being released from prison for manslaughter. Lang's hometown on the outskirts of the Gobi Desert is overrun with stray dogs. He begins working with a local dog patrol team as they aim to reduce the stray animal population in the area ahead of the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing. But Lang develops an unexpected connection with one dog in particular.

The gorgeous, sweeping cinematography captures the breadth of the desert landscape adorned with hundreds of dogs. The film features minimal dialogue, but the combination of Eddie Peng's subtle expressions and the haunting music of Pink Floyd work together to pack an emotional punch. Black Dog is a comforting and cathartic film about loneliness, identity, forgiveness, and redemption. It's a perfect film for dog lovers and anyone who's ever felt like an outsider or needed a second chance. – LA

## **BONJOUR TRISTESSE**

Picture summer in the south of France: the shimmering blue of the bay, bowls heaping with fresh strawberries, and warm evening breezes that sweep over you like a lover's touch, while wine stains your lips a rich red. It's a scene straight out of a dream—one of those rare, picturesque places on Earth where time seems to slow. That is, unless you're one of the wealthy, entitled characters in the latest adaptation of Françoise Sagan's *Bonjour Tristesse*.

In Bonjour Tristesse, up-and-coming filmmaker (and *Variety's* Top 10 Directors to Watch) Durga Chew-Bose crafts a beautifully intimate exploration of self-discovery, love, and the complexities of modern relationships. Cécile (Lily McInerny) and her widowed father, Raymond (Claes Bang, *The Square*), are spending the summer in the south of France with his new girlfriend, Elsa (Nailia Harzoune). Their peaceful routine is shaken when Anne (Chloë Sevigny, in a charismatic performance), a longtime friend of Cécile's parents, arrives unexpectedly.


Anne soon becomes the dominant character, causing tension with Elsa by suddenly taking on a motherly role, pushing schoolwork on Cécile, and putting an end to her time with a local man.

## **BRING THEM DOWN**

### **CHRISTOPHER ANDREWS**

Ireland, UK, Belgium | 2024 | 105 min

Christopher Abbott and Barry Keoghan star in Christopher Andrews' brutally impressive, low-budget debut about two feuding farming families in rural Ireland. *Bring Them Down*, which had its world premiere at this year's Toronto International Film Festival, tells the story of two young men, trapped in a historical cycle of violence and inherited rage. Set in a bleak and remote west Ireland, Michael (Abbott) raises sheep on the family farm where he lives with his aging father Ray (played deftly by Colm Meaney). The father and son duo live together in relative solitude, in the aftermath of a gruesome accident, which saw Michael's mother killed and his girlfriend with permanent facial scars. Michael's girlfriend has since moved on, remarrying into a rival farming family. Her wily son, Jack (Keoghan) is determined to reap revenge on the source of his mother's pain.

Much of the sadness that pervades the lives of our two central characters is left unspoken, escaping only through blackly comic violent acts (the sheep really don't come out well!) and icy aggressions. Both Keoghan and Abbot carry this turmoil - of the modern young man unable to unravel stunted emotions - with profound and acute accuracy. Accompanied by an off-kilter and pounding score, Andrews takes his audience on an intense exploration of human behaviour, and the tragedies of modern masculinity, that is at once painfully tragic and grimly funny. - JD

## FLY ME TO THE MOON

Fly Me to the Moon is the award-winning, masterful debut from Sasha Chuk who serves as the film's writer, director, lead actress, and dialect coach in a semi-autobiographical story inspired by her experience immigrating to Hong Kong as a child. It's a delicate and sincere work of art about identity, family, poverty, discrimination, and addiction.

This intimate, sentimental story is told in three parts over the course of 20 years as two sisters come of age. Yuen (Chuk) and her younger sister Kuet (Angela Yuen) immigrate from Hunan to Hong Kong as children. Their father, Kok Man (Wu Kang-ren) is a drug addict and thief who spends their childhood in and out of prison. Kang-ren's tender and mesmerizing performance offers one of the most realistic depictions of drug addiction, especially that of a drug-addicted parent. As the sisters gradually develop vastly different relationships with their father, the film ponders whether it's possible to break the cycle of generational trauma. Fly Me to the Moon is a quietly moving meditation on family bonds. - LA

Life on a farm and a youthful viewpoint stoke the story in the feature debut of director Courvoisier, a compassionate take on a young rascal, Totone (Clément Faveau) who's suddenly handed a lot of responsibility. Having never helped much at home, he is suddenly solely in charge of his little sister and the farm. After failed attempts at working to support the two of them, he comes upon a cheese competition with a 30,000 Euro prize for the best round of Comté. With the confidence of youth, Totone thinks: how hard can it be? Soon enough Totone is getting advice, stealing milk from a local farm, and falling for a local farmer's daughter (Maïwène Barthelemy).

For a first-time director, it's remarkable how well balanced the characters come across, walking the great tightrope of moving to adulthood from youth and finding a role with a purpose. The camera's eye augments the themes with the way it wanders in and out of frame and the natural light provides the right backdrop for a vulnerable young man filled with bravado. – KK

The Greek Island of Lesbos, the birthplace of Sappho, became a pilgrimage for lesbians all over the world. For decades, director Tzeli Hadjidimitriou, a native of Lesbos and lesbian, captured the lives of the locals who live and work on the island and the lesbians who have gathered every year to play and find community on the beaches of Eressos. Through archival film, photos, and personal diaries, Tzeli explores the struggles, connections, and tensions that have developed and eased over time between the local Greek community and the women's community.

Lesvia interweaves the poetry of Sappho and her legacy with the unique culture of this island that has become a home to a diverse group of people who all believe they have a claim to Lesbos. This fascinating exploration of a place that everyone wants to belong to doesn't shy away from the conflicts, community politics, and history of place that is found in this seaside paradise. - KM


When Jérémie learns that his old boss has passed away, he returns to his hometown to pay his respects. Martine, the late man's wife, can sense he has unresolved feelings towards his late boss and insists that he stay with her for a day or two.

Jérémie's presence isn't entirely welcome though as Martine's son, Vincent, suspects him of taking advantage of the situation. A raw tension brews between the two men as they wrestle with each other, eventually leading Jérémie to an awkward encounter. Soon, he's forced to start lying to Martine about her son, along with the rest of the townsfolk, who increasingly tighten their gaze on this polite and unassuming man who seems almost out of place in this unvarnished village.

Best known for *Stranger by the Lake*, director Alain Guiraudie continues his incisive examination of desire, sexuality, and the entanglements that occur in any small community. Misericordia bubbles with absurdism as it lays out a curious mystery - one that pulls you in not because it withholds the truth from you, but because it asks the why of how humans operate and of our many quiet vulnerabilitie. - AK

### ROSINANTE BARAN GUNDUZALP

Turkey | 2023 | 103 min

An Istanbul couple, Salih and Ayse, are caught in a spiral of downward mobility in this tender first feature from Turkish director, Baran Gunduzalp. When Salih is laid off from his white-collar job and their rental home is faced with demolition, the couple travel about Istanbul on their motorized scooter, named after Rocinante the rickety old horse in Miguel de Cervantes's novel, *Don Quixote*.

When Ayse also loses her call centre job, the couple bicker, struggle, and improvise. Salih has discovered he can use his scooter as a taxi service, and when he is asleep, Ayse takes on the same job using his license, hiding her face and hair under her helmet and like her mute son, never speaking to customers. Working in alternative shifts, the two carry businesspeople, students, and late-night drunks travelling about the city, providing viewers with a visual and social tour of the chaotic beauty of Turkey's capital city. But when Rosinante is stolen, their very survival as a family is in jeopardy. Along with its allusion to the hero of impossible quests, Don Quixote, Rosinante pays homage to a cinema classic, Vitoria De Sica's 1948 Bicycle Thieves, with its plea for compassion in a world of harsh economic precarity. – LL

Immediately after moving into their new home, family man Josh (Ben Foster) and his wife Rachel (Cobie Smulders) see their idyllic suburban life come to a screeching halt when they witness a deadly car accident in front of their property. Rachel suggests burying the traumatic memory and resuming their domestic bliss, but it triggers something in Josh he just can't ignore. As this psychological thriller unfolds, he finds a purpose in his obsession with traffic collisions that draws him deeper into an unhealthy relationship with the carnage he seeks, distracting him from the mundanity of his middle-class existence.

Halifax-based director Jason Buxton adapts Russell Wangersky's short story from his Giller Prize nominated collection 'Whirl Away', cleverly building tension through the common familiarity of the subject matter. As Josh seeks a form of virtuous validation that his job and social circle can't provide, he is led into dangerous territory, possibly losing everything. - AR

A striking and introspective film about transformation and self-discovery. It follows a young Montreal advertising executive Mathyas who, after embracing the life of a Provençal shepherd, finds himself entangled in a series of misadventures with a civil servant who has quit her job on a whim. Together, they embark on a journey that questions their roles in the world and their search for meaning.

The film's setting in the vast wilderness of the French Alps is more than just backdrop—it reflects the emotional terrain the characters navigate. Deraspe's direction is patient, allowing the natural landscape to mirror the internal shifts of the characters. The cinematography is stunning, balancing the harshness of nature with the vulnerability of human experience.

The lead performance is quietly compelling, capturing the complexity of a man caught between old and new lives. The chemistry between the leads adds depth to their relationship, turning their odd partnership into a poignant and sometimes playful exploration of identity and reinvention.

Shepherds is a film about how we adapt to change, the tensions between tradition and reinvention, and the sometimes messy process of finding one's place in the world. Deraspe crafts a rich, thoughtful narrative, free of cliché, that resonates long after the story ends. – RW

The Witness, a fiction feature film by Iranian filmmaker Nader Saeivar, is a stirring tribute to the Woman, Life, Freedom movement and the resilience of women in Iran.

The story centers on Mrs. Ghorbani, a respected elderly history teacher, union member, and social activist, known for her tireless support of women in need. Among them is Zara, a young woman trapped in an abusive marriage to Solat. Mrs. Ghorbani steps in as a mediator, striving to keep Zara safe by offering refuge whenever her husband's abuse escalates. At the heart of their conflict is Zara's passion for teaching dance—a pursuit Solat once accepted but now opposes due to his career ties to the government. A heartfelt homage to the women of the Woman, Life, Freedom movement, *The Witness* honors those who risked everything for the right to live, dance, and dream freely, often at an unthinkable cost. - MS

An enchanting Italian film that beautifully blends humour, heart, and personal transformation. Set in a charming Italian village, the film follows several storylines while offering a captivating, intimate portrayal of life in a small Italian village during the end of World War II.

The film focuses on the Graziadei family. Cesare (Orietta Notari) is a headmaster with ten children, loves classical music, and is a task master. One day their son returns from the war bringing with him a Sicilian soldier. The heart of the story lies in the relationship between daughter Lucia (Martina Scrinzi) and Pietro (Giuseppe De Domenico), the soldier. Pietro, a shy and illiterate man, forms a tender connection with Lucia, whose quiet, introspective nature makes her a perfect match for him. Their blossoming romance is beautifully understated, grounded in simple, intimate moments, and eventually leads to marriage. Lucia's emotional journey, from initial hope to deep sorrow, is portrayed with remarkable sensitivity by Scrinzi.

Vermiglio is a celebration of second chances, the ties that bind us, and the enduring power of family and community. It's a film that effortlessly blends personal redemption with universal themes of love and connection. Warm, uplifting, and beautifully crafted, Vermiglio is a cinematic gem that will leave you with a smile and a renewed sense of hope.

ANU VALIA

India-born, Indiana-raised, director Anu Valia won a Sundance jury award in 2017 for her short film, *Lucia: Before and After*, about a young woman waiting for an abortion in Texas. She followed that with work on prestige series such as *The Afterparty* and *Awkwafina is Nora* from Queens.

Her debut feature, *We Strangers*, shot in her hometown of Gary, Indiana. It's a character study of Rayelle, young African American office cleaner, played by the English actress Kirby Howell-Baptiste, with a deeply observant presence. As the film opens, Rayelle is persuaded to clean a dentist's personal home, and, almost immediately after, to clean his neighbours' home as well. Compulsively unable to say no, Rayelle soon finds herself at two different families' command which leads to stress to her domestic life, parenting the two kids she has with her partner, Mari.

Then there's the psychological burden, as Rayelle soon finds herself privy to her employers' marital intrigues and habitual oversharing. When one client expresses her fascination with TV psychics, Rayelle, on an impulse, pretends that she, too, has clairvoyant powers. That claim confirms her employers' view of her "Otherness" and makes her an object of their fascination, which works to her advantage until it doesn't anymore.

Director Varia avoids a simple didactic approach to race and class tensions, channeling Spanish master Luis Buñuel in a biting critique of bourgeois morality, with moments of absurd humour, and an aesthetic contrast between the dreamy warmth of her domestic space and the chilly, suburban homes she works in. – LL

At the start of writer/director Omar S. Kamara's debut feature African Giants. Sheku poeticizes a credo from his father: that people will come and go, but you only have one brother. There's nothing like time with family to remind you of your core identity.

Reunited for a weekend in Los Angeles, two Sierra Leone-American brothers discover the people they've become in their time apart. Alhaji (Dillon Daniel Mutyaba), the charming older brother living in L.A. with his acting career on the verge of taking off, and Sheku (Omete Anassi), the whip smart student on the path to a law degree, clash over ideologies and celebrate each other's wins. But when Sheku reveals his interest in pursuing acting, the cracks in Alhaji's facade begin to show. Despite resenting the intense pressure of his father's tough love approach to raising them, Alhaji finds himself falling into the same role. He risks pushing Sheku away and isolating himself even further.

Mixing direct-to-camera interludes into the more traditional narrative, Kamara crafts a delightful two-hander full of tough conversations embedded in the banter of two brothers remembering where and who they come from. - ML



Keeping the focus on Mayenka, the story weaves together the personal and the collective. Mayenka's journey into teenage motherhood serves as a window into systemic issues, intertwining social consciousness with ancestral wisdom."



Imagine women who didn't want to call it a strike because that's too aggressive. These statements take the film from being a fun look back to something inspiring. The film's producer, Hrafnhildur Gunnarsdóttir, at 11 years old was in that square with her mother and the energy and unexpected power was palpable. Five years after the Day Off, Icelanders voted in the world's first democratically elected female president and currently women hold 48 percent of the seats in parliament. – KK

### THE SUMMER BOOK

It has taken a long while for Tove Jansson's novel, *The Summer Book*, to be adapted to screen. The memoir, from Finland's famous writer of the classic Moomins books for children, offers a deeply personal account of an elderly artist and her six-year-old grand-daughter who spend a summer together on a tiny island in the Gulf of Finland. As the two learn to adjust to each other's fears, idiosyncrasies, and desires, a fierce but understated love emerges, that becomes more expansive than the island itself. The memoir is layered with subtextual emotions and sadness, and written with a sparse anti-sentimentalism that perhaps explains why the wait for a screen adaptation has been so long. Thankfully, Charlie McDowell's film adaptation, starring a vibrant Glenn Close, approaches the source material with profound delicacy, and the film is imbued with Jansson's characteristic lightness of touch, managing somehow to evoke deep emotion.

In the wake of her mother's death, Sophia (played by impressive newcomer Emily Matthews), her grandmother (Close), and father (Anders Danielsen Lie) spend a summer on an island off the Gulf of Finland. Many of the narrative's key dramatic events have happened outside the frame of the film. Instead, the audience is gently invited into the peace of personal processes - grief, growth, patience - amidst the life-giving embrace of a beautiful natural environment. In this sense, the film is without high drama or tension. Instead, McDowell offers a near meditative reflection on family bonds, growing up, and understanding deeply, which is warmly faithful to Tove Jansson's delicately beautiful approach to storytelling. - JD

In a bold act of defiance, she sabotages the Moretti family business with William's help, hoping to prevent the marriage and protect her daughter from the same fate.

As Italy's first post-war election approaches, Delia, empowered by her newly won right to vote, finds the strength to confront her controlling husband and fight for her freedom. In her directorial debut, Cortellesi (Best Debut Director and Actress, Academy of Italian Cinema) explores themes of empowerment, self-determination, and the struggle for personal freedom, as Delia fights to secure a better future for herself and her daughter. - MH





Having always wanted a daughter, and after her father's passing, she begins to re-examine the dynamics of her family before setting out to adopt a girl. The true complexities of the process quickly begin to reveal themselves, while her husband, Rino, is confounded by the decision. Their relationship begins to strain, and soon both must come face-to-face with the reality that there are no easy paths or certain guarantees when it comes to the immense responsibility of opening their family up to a new person.

Vittoria is an intimate story about family connection and communication, which becomes even more powerful with the knowledge that the two people in the lead roles are a real-life couple. Jasmine and Rino are played by partners who went through a similar adoption process themselves, and together they bring stunning tension and intimacy to the screen. Much like they opened themselves up to adoption, they open their family history to us, in a touching reminder of the catharsis found within art and cinema. – AK

In late Edo-period Japan, two samurai engage in a fierce duel. When a bolt of lightning strikes, it hurls Kosaka (Makiya Yamaguchi) through time, waking him in present-day Japan. Disoriented, he finds himself on the set of a modern jidaigeki (period film) TV series, surrounded by people in both period costumes and contemporary attire, armed with modern gadgets. Mistaken for an extra by Yuko (Yuno Sakura), a driven assistant director, Kosaka's exceptional swordsmanship leads to an unexpected role as kirareyaku—the actor hired to dramatically die on screen.

A Samurai in Time blends humor with heart, presenting an ironically hilarious premise: a noble samurai, centuries removed from his time, flourishing as a stuntman in a world he can barely comprehend. But beyond the laughs, the film poignantly explores themes of change, adaptation, and the passage of time.

Kosaka's journey isn't just about mastering stunt choreography; it's about reconciling the rigid code of the samurai with the fluidity of modern life. As the samurai era fades, Kosaka must navigate a world that no longer has a place for him, ultimately finding hope and redemption in the evolving Japan around him.

### FOUR MOTHERS

#### DARREN THORNTON

Ireland, UK | 2024 | 89 min

Four Mothers marks a return for Irish writer-director Thornton, whose 2016 debut A Date for Mad Mary charmed festival audiences around the world. Four Mothers, his second feature, is a reinterpretation of Gianni Di Gregorio's 2008 film Mid-August Lunch, a Chekhovian drama about an Italian mother and son, facing the realities of older age.

In *Four Mothers*, the sundrenched streets of Rome are replaced with grey suburban Ireland, but all the colour you could ever need is provided by co-writer Colin Thorton's witty dialogue, which is infused with an astute and perceptive grasp of queer belonging and friendship.

Edward is in his mid-thirties. He's a single gay man, writing young adult novels about queer romance, though his own romantic escapades on the local dating scene leave much to be desired. Played brilliantly by relative newcomer James McArdle, (a Scotsman best known for his work on stage and TV, here adopting a convincing Irish accent with all the required charm for the silver screen!) Edward cares dutifully for his mother, Alma, who at 81, occupies much of his time after being restricted to a wheelchair following a severe stroke. Of course, Edward's love for Alma is not without frustration - especially as he tries to juggle the commitments of an impending US Book tour. Edward finds solidarity and comic relief in his community of gay friends—Colm (Gearoid Farrelly), Billy (Gordon Hickey), and his closeted, recently-divorced therapist Dermot (Rory O'Neill)—all of whom are also stuck in suffocating relationships with their mothers. However, when they plan a Pride Holiday to reclaim their freedom, Edward is unexpectedly left to care for all four mothers at once.

Four Mothers is a profoundly touching portrait of family love and commitment, and all the complexities that can entangle us in situations of caregiving that stretch beyond our control. Thornton beautifully weaves a narrative of friendship, community, and humour into this web of familial duty, underlining them as a vital lifeline that in turn keeps the carer feeling alive. – JD

British comedian and ventriloquist Nina Conti's directorial debut, *Sunlight*, premiered at the Edinburgh Film Festival in 2024, a fitting place for a performer who has delighted festival audiences for years. *Sunlight* is quite unlike anything you will have seen before - a completely original, dark and comic take on road movies. It's about a monkey, a radio host who narrowly escapes the clutches of death, and a dead man's watch.

This most unusual romantic comedy-drama stars Shenoah Allen as Roy, a suicidal radio journalist who is contemplating the end of his life in a tragic motel room somewhere in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Waking up in his Airstream, Roy discovers he has been rescued by a stranger wearing a full monkey suit. He learns that the Monkey is Jane (Conti), who has decided that "Jane" doesn't exist, and Monkey is the one who'll be making all the decisions now. As they set off on an unlikely road-trip, Monkey – who never takes the suit off, even in the heat of the American desert highways – and Roy strike up an unlikely romance.

In this bizarre road movie narrative that has traces of Lenny Abrahamson's *Frank* (2014), two seemingly incongruous worlds (one enclosed in a monkey suit!) collide together in an offbeat and unconventional love story that provokes belly-laughs and sadness in equal measure.




Peter Tangvald was a fearless Norwegian seafarer whose adventurous exploits, free from societal expectations, came to a sudden and tragic end as his boat sank off the West Indies coast. Left behind were former lovers and children including his daughter Virginia. Only five years old when her father died, in the decades that have passed she's worked to piece together his story and in turn, her own. A remarkable archive of family photos and videos blends with current day interviews, constructing a portrait of a complicated and fiercely independent man.

Reconnecting with siblings, she probes the mystery of her father's life and through the emotional process grieves those who can no longer share their story, including her brother Thomas, who also disappeared at sea on his own ship. An intimate family story, Virginia transcends personal trauma to deliver a heartfelt film that breaks cycles of harm and bares difficult truths through a moving exploration of loss and resilience. -AR

Through rare archival footage, Chung recounts his experience capturing the group's early days, culminating in their seminal 2002 album, *You Forgot It in People*. This critically acclaimed record catapulted Toronto onto the global music scene, shedding light on the city's vibrant indie landscape.

Chung's ever-present lens quietly chronicles the collective's organic formation, comprised of artists, musicians, and friends navigating creative passions, personal relationships, and professional growth. Broken Social Scene's success spawned a wave of cutting-edge bands, solo projects, and collaborations, cementing their influence on contemporary indie rock.

As a cinematographer, Chung's footage, spanning the group's formative years, humanizes Broken Social Scene's journey from local favorites to international sensation. The film deftly employs the use of archival footage interwoven with present-day interviews that underscore the band's connection to Chung, who's hailed for always watching in the shadows, and credited as a major part of the glue that's kept the band together for over two decades.

It's All Gonna Break delves into the complexities of friendship and success, offering a poignant testament to the power of creative collaboration, and the enduring legacy of Broken Social Scene. - LW

No one ever had to tell Liza Minnelli, a performer of trembling vulnerability and commanding stage presence, to "go big" but many helped her along the way as we learn from Bruce David Klein's eye-opening and affectionate biographical film. Launched as a teen star in the shadow of her legendary, tragic mother, Judy Garland, the now 77-year-old performer created her own persona, a living cartoon of popeyed, ball of energy in sequined gowns with the thrilling voice, mascara eyes and sky-punching dance moves. But how did she get to be Liza with a Z?

Bolstered by interviews with fellow performers Mia Farrow, Ben Vereen, Chita Rivera, and Joel Grey, the archival and contemporary interviews, explore the influence of her godmother, Kay Thompson, the actress, Minelli's director father, Vincent Minnelli, the choreographer and director Bob Fosse, the French star, Charles Aznavour who showed her how to tell a story in a song, Cabaret lyricist Fred Ebb and designer Halston, each of whom was catalyzed by her presence and ambition. -LL

# **PAUL ANKA: HIS WAY**

**JOHN MAGGIO** 

USA | 2024 | 100 min

On his podcast, *Smartless*, actor Jason Bateman summarized the professional accomplishments of his secret guest, also his father-in-law, the singer-songwriter Paul Anka: 900 songs to his credit, 130 albums, more than 90 million album and singles sales, and the only artist in history to have songs on the Billboard Top 100 in seven decades. In a musical form where most artist's careers have the durability of a popsicle stick, Anka is an entertainment industry freak.

John Maggio's documentary mixes a candid interview with the now 83-year-old performer as he swaps stories of hanging with the Rat Pack and working for The Mob, interspersed with footage of Anka belting it out to cheering crowds on stages from New York to Tokyo on his 2023 world tour.

Using a trove of archival video and film, including clips from the 1962 acclaimed National Film Board cinema verité documentary, *Lonely Boy*, John Maggio's film reveals Anka as a driven creator who has reinvented himself repeatedly to satisfy his ambition and feed the "needle in the arm" reward of audience adulation. The son of Lebanese Syrian restauranteurs in Ottawa, Anka hit the big time in the late fifties a pudgy teen idol with a pompadour and a mellow tenor and, uniquely, a string of self-penned hits, including *Diana* and *Puppy Love*.

When The Beatles swept the teen idol era into history, Anka went to Europe to record in Italian and French, returned to establish himself as a night club performer, and later became a fixture of 70s easy-listening radio. Through the film, viewers are reminded of his irrefutable genius for making hits: You Are My Destiny written for his mother, Buddy Holly's posthumous hit I Guess It Doesn't Matter Any More, The Tonight Show theme, Frank Sinatra's signature tune My Way, Tom Jones' She's A Lady, as well as collaborations with Michael Jackson (This Is It) and fellow Canadian, Drake. Whatever decade you prefer, there's a good chance you will leave the theatre with one of his earworms spinning in your head. -LL

# SAMIA YASEMIN ŞAMDERELI & DEKA MOHAMED

Samia is a masterful film, helmed by Yasemin Şamdereli, about the eponymous, strong-willed, Somalian young woman whose gift of speed transforms her life.

From a young age, it was clear that Samia was destined to sprint her way to greatness. As civil unrest amplifies in her hometown Mogadishu, Samia's ability to train becomes hampered by local militias staunchly opposed to women engaging in sports. When Samia's father and biggest champion suddenly dies, her mother defies their society's conservative values and rallies her family in support of Samia's dream to race and honour her father's memory.

Samia's discipline and determination take her all the way to the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games, which sparks a fire inside her to make the 2012 London Olympics a reality. Her return to Africa amidst the ongoing civil war confirms her suspicions – if representing Somalia at the next Olympics is in her future, she needs to leave. As Samia's journey unfolds, she becomes a powerful testament to the human spirit, showcasing the resilience, courage, and determination that define a champion.

Inspired by true events, and with a stellar performance from newcomer Ilham Mohamed Osman, Samia offers an inspirational, thought-provoking look at a gifted athlete's pursuit of greatness that demands a high price. -LW



# THE DIAMOND COUPLE

**SONJA BERTUCCI**

Filmmaker expected to attend

There's a distinct sense of privilege in getting to know Betty and Morrie Maroff, the charming elderly Jewish couple who are the stars of Sonja Bertucci's deeply intimate documentary. The Maroffs aren't just elderly, they're centenarians, with their memories, curiosity, love of the arts, and concern with the state of the world still intact. Shot over eight years, the film begins in 2022, three years after Betty's death, as Morrie, then 107, talks about missing being able to share the memories they made together. Bertucci's film takes us back to a few years earlier when Betty was alive, as the couple tell stories and argue around their kitchen table, augmented by excerpts from her detailed travel journals and his copious, artistically sophisticated photographs. Most moving is the portrait of the give and take of their marriage, shaped both by the conventions of their upbringing and personal wounds. Under Bertucci's gentle probing, the self-deprecating Betty opens up about both her admiration and frustrations with her irrepressibly confident husband who, for all his talents, "had a lot to learn about emotions." -LL


