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

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


What can go wrong?

- Distraction not attending to the right thing
- Overload too much for working memory
- Unconnected knowledge memories will not be secure
- Weakened pathways unable to recall information when needed

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Typical Forgetting Curve for Newly Learned Information



Most Effective Strategies Supported by a number of robust studies and effective in most forms of learning.	Strategies with Much Promise Found to be effective in some forms of learning and where there is some supporting evidence.	Less Useful Strategies Found to be ineffective.

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


Winning Strategies


- Be active engage with the material
- Be specific plan to revise specific topics and achieve specific tasks
- Spread it out, mix it up
- Focus on getting it 'out' rather than 'in'
- More testing, less studying
- Know yourself



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






Cycle

Fishbone Diagram




Relations Diagram

- Eat breakfast and keep hydrated
- Create the right environment to learn
- Don't listen to music
- Fresh air and exercise
- Sleeping patterns
- Put the phone away / limit distractions



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What can you do to help from home?

- Speak to your child. Ask them if they are struggling with their workload, revision or specific subjects. This will hopefully prevent the 'avoidance tactic'. Ask them how they are revising and the strategies they are using.
- Help them to plan their revision time. Talk to them about using a range of effective revision approaches. Short, focused revision sessions are most effective (25-30 mins)
- Test them! This can be as simple as discussing the topic over lunch or finding some set questions on a topic.
- Be positive. You cannot learn it for them. Keep up positive reinforcement for their hard work and try to avoid being critical. There's still a long way to go....

Help! I can't convince my child to revise!

- If revising and school work is causing arguments at home, it is time to try a different approach.
- Try to find a hook to motivate them. What do they want from the future? How are they going to get there? Help them see a path to their success via positive outcomes from their exams.
- Take a break!
