The Wider Church

"My religion is very simple. My religion is kindness."

These are the words of Tenzin Gyatso, the 14th Dalai Lama, whose 90th birthday is today, July 6. He represents an ancient Buddhist tradition, although he is the first Dalai Lama to become a world-renowned figure and a religious leader on a global stage.

Born in China of Tibetan parentage, he was recognized as the incarnation of the 13th Dalai Lama in 1937, enthroned in 1940, and vested with full powers as head of state in 1950. In 1959, he fled to exile in India — the year Tibetans mounted an unsuccessful revolt against communist Chinese forces that had occupied the country since 1950. He set up a government—in—exile in India, where he has continued to reside.

During the early part of his exile, he didn't travel much, but he published two books, an introduction to Buddhism and an autobiography. But later he traveled quite extensively, visiting Europe for the first time in 1973 and the United States in 1979. Since then he has traveled to dozens of other countries. His activities have focused on political matters concerning Tibet and wider philosophical matters on Buddhism and religion in the modern world. In recognition of his efforts, he was awarded the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1989.

In an essay "A Human Approach to World Peace," he wrote, "Interfaith understanding will bring about the unity necessary for all religions to work together. However, although this is indeed an important step, we must remember that there are no quick or easy solutions. We cannot hide the doctrinal differences that exist among various faiths, nor can we hope to replace the existing religions by a new universal belief. Each religion has its own distinctive contributions to make, and each in its own way is suitable to a particular group of people as they understand life. The world needs them all."
