EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Established in late 2024, Australians for Better Government (ABG) is dedicated to improving the way we vote, the structure of our Government and the wording of our Constitution.

Australians for Better Government believes that we can no longer rely on politicians to drive political change in this Country. We need a grassroots People's movement. ABG aims to be that movement.

Elected Members of Parliament often serve their own ambitions, or the will of their political party, rather than faithfully representing the interests and concerns of their constituents.

This has contributed to a decline in Western civilisation, and Australia is not immune. The ideal of our Government was based firmly on the Separation of Powers between the Legislature, Executive and Judiciary. This 'separation' has been blurred, resulting in the Government of the day in the Legislature appointing the Executive and Judiciary. Where is the separation and why do we allow it to continue?

In the Senate, political parties vote along party lines, instead of reviewing legislation on its merits and acting as a 'House of Review'. Why do we allow this to continue?

ABG will begin the discussion, among everyday Australians, to fix these issues and others outlined in this document.

UNDERSTANDING THE PROBLEM

Australia has always been the Lucky Country, but in recent years it is beginning to feel like something is badly wrong.

Issues that Australians now face:

- The gross National debt is forecast to reach \$1.067 trillion by the end of the 2026-27 financial year, as forecast in the 2023-24 Federal budget.
- Electricity prices have skyrocketed and we face the risk of blackouts, despite previously having cheap, abundant and reliable energy.
- We are ceding our energy independence by rejecting coal, gas and nuclear power. Instead we are importing wind and solar components from the rest of the World, mainly our strategic opponents.
- Housing and rentals are unaffordable with many young Australians having no prospects of owning a home. This is despite previous generations being able to support a family, buy a car and pay off a mortgage on a single income.
- Our manufacturing industry has moved offshore and it is almost nonexistent.
- Individual freedoms are being eroded with threats to free speech, bodily autonomy and the introduction of a digital ID.
- Our health system is in crisis, with many Australians turned away at hospitals or facing extended delays without care or treatment.
- Defence capabilities are minimal and recruitment is at an all-time low.
- We are heavily taxed with no serious discussions on tax reform.

MINISTERS SELECTED ON MERIT

Currently, Government Ministers are selected from a pool of generally unexceptional people who are elected Members of the Legislature.

THE CULPRIT? One line in Our Constitution **completely wrecks** our system of Government - the 'Ministers to sit in Parliament' line in Section 64.

COMPARE THE PAIR

THE CURRENT SYSTEM: Minister for Defence - Richard Marles MP

- Joined the Melbourne University Labor Club in his first week at University.
- Former legal officer for the Transport Workers Union and later their National Assistant Secretary.
- Joined Australia's peak union body, the Australian Council of Trade Unions as Assistant Secretary in 2000.
- Devoted Geelong Cats supporter, golf fanatic, a keen photographer and snowdome collector.



A BETTER OPTION FOR DEFENCE?: General Peter Cosgrove



- Graduated in 1968 from the Royal Military College.
- Fought in Vietnam, commanding a rifle platoon.
- Awarded the Military Cross in 1971 for his performance and leadership during an assault on enemy positions.
- Commander of the International Task Force East Timor (INTERFET) in 1999.
- Appointed Chief of Army in 2000.
- As General, served as Chief of the Defence Force.

CONCLUSION

Removing the 'Minister to sit in Parliament' line from Our Constitution would allow the Governor-General to select Ministers from the broader Australian population, allowing for a merit based appointment.

OUR MISSION

REFORMING THECONSTITUTION

We believe it is imperative that the Constitution defines the relationship between The People and the Government as being one of Master and Servant, respectively.

Our Proposals

- To advocate for a National Referendum to replace Section 51 subsection (xxvi) of the Australian Constitution otherwise known as the 'race clause', with a clause which forbids any form of discrimination on the basis of a citizen's race, sex or ancestry within the Commonwealth.
- To reform the Senate of Australia by banning any party affiliation of Senators, to ensure the Senate is a true 'House of Review'. This would also apply to State Upper Houses.
- All Constitutions at Federal, State and Territory level should only be altered by way of Referenda, voted upon by the eligible citizens of that constituency.


IMPROVING THE VOTE

We believe it is in everyone's interest that people elected to Public office are of the highest calibre possible. Thorough discussion needs to take place to improve the quality of Australia's elected representatives.

Our Proposals

- Make it compulsory that voters provide photographic identification at the polling booth so that they can be positively identified.

- Abolish above the line voting in all Upper House elections throughout the Commonwealth.
- Each ballot should list candidates in a random order.
- Party affiliation of candidates to not be shown on the ballot paper.





OUR MISSION

ENSURING A TRUE SEPARATION OF POWERS

Separation of powers divides the power to govern between the Legislature (House of Parliament), the Executive (Ministry) and the Judiciary (Courts).

In reality, the Australian system has no clear separation between the three branches of government. We believe this needs to change.

Our Proposals

To push for Referendums to require that all Federal, State and Territory Governments adopt a system, in which:

- The Governor-General, State Governors and Federal and State Attorney Generals will be elected by popular vote.
- The Governor-General and Governors will exercise the power of the Executive with the right to select Ministers.
- Remove the 'Ministers to sit in Parliament' line in Section
 64 of the Constitution to allow the Governor-General to select
 Ministers from the broader Australian population. To also extend to States.
- Attorney-Generals must never have been a member of the judiciary.
- Reintroduce the Legislative Council (Upper House) of Queensland.

ENSHRINING OUR FREEDOMS

We believe that a continual conversation must take place amongst the Australian people on how our society can enshrine and guarantee our freedoms to ensure that Australians will always remain free.

Our Proposals

- Insert into Constitutions, at all levels of Government within the Commonwealth, guarantees to the inalienable rights of citizens per a Bill of Rights, such as but not limited to:
 - o free speech
 - the right to bodily autonomy
 - the free practice of religion
 - the right to peaceful assembly
 - o the right to publish
 - the right to trial by jury





DIRECT DEMOCRACY

We believe the people should be given a direct say in certain decisions of Government. The Australian people should always have the final say, not politicians.

Our Proposals

- In certain circumstances, Governments must obtain approval from the People by way of a binding plebiscite, before:
 - incurring Government debt
 - declaring a State of Emergency
 - signing International treaties
 - o selling or demolishing public assets
- Introduce Recall Elections as a method of imposing accountability upon our elected representatives.
- Introduce Citizens Initiated Referenda to allow the People to drive change.
